

UPGRADE OF CLUB PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM



After several months (many months) of trying to find a person(s) with the skills / know-how to advise on how we upgrade our loudspeaker system, we finally had a win.

Previous excursions into this area made it appear we would need to spend between \$800 - \$1500 to either upgrade our existing equipment or to purchase new. But we just seemed to be going around in circles.

Recently we took our existing unit into JarCar in Sherriffs Road, Reynella. This proves to be most satisfying as the people behind the desk were technicians who knew their business.

They soon provided a quotation on what we would need to upgrade the existing equipment to the tune of approximately \$500.

This we felt seemed a good road to go down. But we were then advised that JarCar had a NEW, full sound system, including 3 wireless microphones: one lapel: one earloop (which is the direction we wished to go) as well as one standard "boom" microphone. It had its own transmitter, receiver amplifier, loudspeaker, with tone control and external equipment handling (eg CD player or similar). This unit was available for \$299.00.



However, when a price check was undertaken it was discovered that this unit was on "Special" and was available for \$249.00.

We asked around and it was agreed that we should purchase this new unit.

WINDOWS 7

Use Hidden International Wallpapers and Themes

When you first install Windows 7, it asks for your language, time and currency. Based on your responses, it installs a set of wallpapers and themes. If you choose English (United States) for your time and currency format, for example, the available desktop backgrounds and themes will include a United States section with scenery from locations such as Maine, the Southwest and so on.

Hidden, though, are background scenery and themes from other English-speaking countries -- Australia, Canada, Great Britain and South Africa. Normally, you can't access those backgrounds or themes, but there is a simple way you can install and use them:

- 1. In the search box in the Start menu, type **C:\Windows\Globalization\MCT** and press Enter. (Note: If Windows 7 is installed in a drive other than C:, use that letter instead.)
- 2. Windows Explorer will launch and show you a list of subfolders under C:\Windows\Globalization\MCT: MCT-AU, MCT-CA, MCT-GB, MCT-US, and MCT-ZA. Each subfolder has wallpapers for a specific country: AU for Australia, CA for Canada, GB for Great Britain, US for the United States, and ZA for South Africa.

For any of the countries whose wallpaper and themes you want to use, go into its Theme folder, for example, C:\Windows\Globalization\MCT\MCT-ZA\Theme. Double-click the theme you see there (for example ZA).

3. That will install a shortcut to the theme and wallpapers in the Personalization section of Control Panel.

. Presentation Mode

For those who regularly connect laptops to projectors and TV's you can now press the "Windows Key + P" to set the presentation mode of the laptop. You can redirect your display to the computer, projector or both.



THE TWELVE DAYS OF CHRISTMAS

From 1558 until 1829 CE, Roman Catholics in England were not allowed to practice their faith openly. Someone during that era wrote this carol as catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning; the surface meaning, plus a hidden meaning known only to members of their church.

Each element in the carol has a code word for a religious reality, which the children could remember.

- The partridge in a pear tree was Jesus Christ.

- The five golden rings recalled the Torah or Law, the first five books of the Old Testament.

- Seven swans a-swimming represented the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit: Prophesy, Serving, Teaching, Exhortation, Contribution, Leadership, and Mercy.
- The eight maids a milking were the eight beatitudes.
- Nine ladies dancing were the nine fruits of the Holy Ghost: Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, Self-control.
- The ten lords a-leaping were the Ten Commandments.
- Eleven pipers piping stood for the eleven faithful disciples.
- Twelve drummers drumming symbolized the twelve points of belief in the Apostles' Creed.
