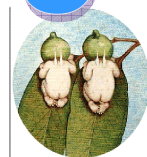

Last month's meeting (January) - Backing up

A great turnout last month to hear two of our computer wizards (Jim and Trevor) show different ways of backing up.

We had no visitors and welcomed 3 new members:

Lloyd and Elaine Russell
Helen Stewart

Jim commenced the evening talks reminding us why we **MUST** backup our data.

Why?

- In case data is lost
- Computer may die or be stolen

What?

- Documents
- Photos
- Family history programs
- Finance records
- Itunes music/videos
- My favourites
- Emails and contacts
- Downloads
- Desktop
- Dropbox (if you have it)



Housekeeping

- Do a full virus scan to ensure your backup is virus and malware free.
- Do a computer defrag. (Note: NEVER defrag solid state drive, memory sticks or external hard drives.)
- Run hardware 5-10 mins before backup to normalise harddrive.
- Remove rubbish on computer, especially your email account. DO NOT backup .exe files that are in your email account, move them to another file outside (this is the most popular place for a virus to take hold).

Last month - cont'd

- Only keep approx 30 files in each email folder (inbox, deleted, junk mail etc). Attachment are at risk, not the text itself.

How?

1. Make a folder on hard drive called "back-up <date>"
2. Make sub-folder for each folder to be backed up.
3. Click desktop, highlight everything, copy and paste into hard drive folder.
4. Repeat above for other folders, eg documents, pictures etc.

Don't keep backups near your computer, preferably store at another residence.

Trevor then showed us how to backup automatically using commercial programs. Some points:



- Microsoft Backup is free but uses zip or encrypted files and is hard to do.
- Other programs are available at a cost but easier to use.
- Does a direct backup of databases.
- Can open directly or zip (compression)
- Automatically backs up when told to do and provides a backup log.
- A full backup places all files in a selected folder.
- **Computer must be turned on for automatic backup to work.**
- **Don't leave the hard drive in your computer all the time -**

**More risk of a virus
Will wear out sooner.**

Trevor then showed us how the KLS program works.

This topic is such an important and complex subject that our meeting went over time. Hopefully you learnt a lot and all went home to back up your computers.

TONIGHT'S MEETING - SKYPE

Skype was first released in August 2003, purchased by eBay in 2005 and Microsoft bought it in May 2011.

It is a telecommunications software that specialises in providing video chat and voice calls from computers, tablets and mobile devices via the Internet to other devices or telephones/smartphones.

Users can also send instant messages, exchange files and photos, send video messages and create conference calls.

It can be downloaded onto computers running Microsoft Windows, Mac or Linux as well as Android, Blackberry, iOS and Windows smartphones and tablets.

Much of the service is free, but users will need Skype Credit or a subscription to call landline or mobile numbers.

What's happening in 2015 - Windows 10

Microsoft announced that Office will be free for Windows 10 apps and preinstalled on Windows tablets and phones. Pricing for Office 2016 has not been released. There is an expectation Office 2016 will be designed for business and cost extra. It is being released late 2015.



If you are running Windows 7, 8.1 and Windows Phone 8.1, Microsoft will make Windows 10 available for free. The only catch, it will be free for 12 months from the date it is commercially available. Not sure what it will cost after that.

Apple has Siri, Microsoft has Cortana and Cortana is coming to Windows 10. A personal digital assistant, Cortana will be able to do things like open a powerpoint presentation. Cortana is also in the cloud and will interact with your connected devices.

This evening we will learn all about SKYPE.

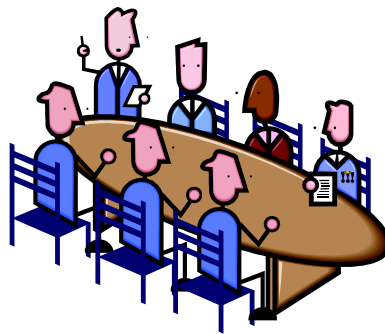

Committee Capers.

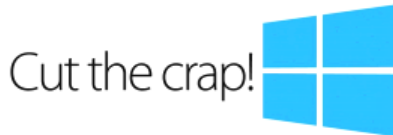
This month's committee meeting was held on Monday February 9th.



Subjects up for discussion were:

- All club power cables have now been tested.
- The committee had a request to help with scanning and editing photos. Anne Leddra will follow this up
- Membership fees was discussed and to be considered later in the year with a possible slight increase.
- We will commence a 12 month subscription to the magazine PC & Tech Authority. It was also suggested Jim download programs (eg Avast, AVG) onto a USB stick for the use of members. Should a member require one of these programs, they can bring their laptops to monthly meetings between 6pm and 7pm.

CRAPWARE - DOWNLOADING FREeware



“Should you download from a trusted source?” There isn’t a freeware download site that is free of *crapware* or adware. Here’s the result of our investigation to prove it.

We installed the top 10 apps from **Download.com** and you will never believe what happened!

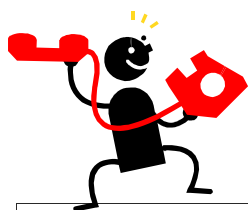
We were unable to find a single freeware download site that isn’t listing bundleware awfulness, and while a few of them attempt to do the right thing and alert you when something is bundled, it is just not good enough. Nobody reads the fine print, just like nobody reads the installers when they are clicking through.

And some of these installers are extremely tricky. They move the buttons around. They change the text or, in some cases they make it look exactly like a terms and conditions screen. They hijack browsers, insert ads and they even use hidden services with dark API functions. The latest trend is pushing lookalike copies of Google Chrome with adware bundled directly into them.

The fact is, everybody is doing it to some extent by providing downloads that include this nonsense - the worst offenders are adding their own install wrapper to make sure that you get punished. Freeware isn’t actually *free software* and we are all paying for it now.

The ironic thing is that most of these downloads are hijacking your browser - away from Google. Sadly, even on Google, all the top results for most open source and freeware are just ads for really terrible sites that are bundling crapware and malware on top of the installer.

So, if you absolutely must download some stupid freeware from somewhere, you may as well punch yourself in the face. And then either find the real site (ignoring the ads) or **use Ninite** or **test it out on a virtual machine first**, or consider just buying software from a programmer that deserves the money. You may switch to **OS** or **Linux**. When the product is free, the real product is YOU.

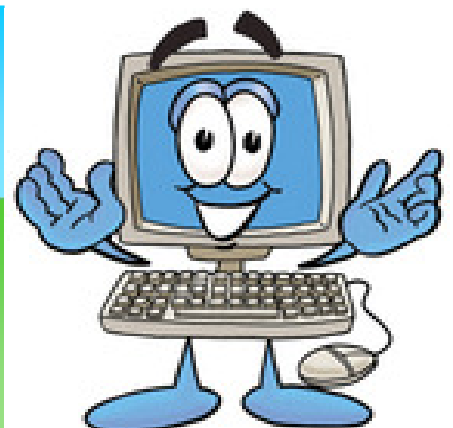
