PRINT SCREEN

When working with WORD you can make good use of the "*PRINT SCREEN* " button, in combination with the 'CUT' and ' PASTE ' commands.

If you wish to add the image of a screen to a document, first select the screen you want, then press:-

' PRINT SCREEN '.

Follow this with the 'Ctrl' + 'C' combination to copy the print screen image.

Next go to WORD and open your document, place your cursor in the desired position and press "Ctrl" + 'V' combination.

Your screen shot will now appear in the Word document.

Difficult to read +

When reading in CAPITALS most people find it more difficult than reading in Lower Case.

There is an email etiquette most people follow; a set of unwritten rules of what to do; one of them being do not write in Capitals. Apart from the reading difficulties it may present it is considered to be shouting which many take exception to.

Don't forward virus hoaxes and chain letters.

If you receive an email message warning you of a new unstoppable virus that will immediately delete everything from your computer, this is most probably a hoax.

By forwarding hoaxes you use valuable bandwidth and sometimes virus hoaxes contain viruses themselves, by attaching a socalled file that will stop the dangerous virus.

The same goes for chain letters that promise incredible riches or ask your help for a charitable cause. Even if the content seems to be bona fide, the senders are usually not. Since it is impossible to find out whether a chain letter is real or not, the best place for it is the recycle bin.

Use proper structure & layout.

Since reading from a screen is more difficult than reading from paper, the structure and lay out is very important for e-mail messages.

Use short paragraphs and blank lines between each paragraph. When making points, number them or mark each point as separate to keep the overview.

Don't reply to spam.

By replying to spam or by unsubscribing, you are confirming that your email address is 'live'. Confirming this will only generate even more spam.

Therefore, just hit the delete button or use email software to remove spam automatically
