## Recipe Corner

## LEMONADE SCONES

Ingredients<br>300 g (2 cups) self-raising flour, sifted 55 g ( $1 / 4$ cup) caster sugar<br>125 ml ( $1 / 2$ cup) thick cream<br>$125 \mathrm{ml}(1 / 2$ cup) lemonade<br>40ml (2 tbs) milk

## Method

Preheat the oven to $220^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$. Lightly grease a baking tray.
Place the flour, sugar and $1 / 2$ teaspoon salt in a large bowl. Add the cream and lemonade and mix to form a soft dough. Turn out onto a lightly floured workbench and knead lightly until combined. Press the dough with your hands to a thickness of about 2 cm . Use a 6 cm round cutter to cut out 8 scones, place on baking tray and brush the tops with some milk. Bake for 10-15 minutes until lightly browned. Serve with jam and cream.

## ORANGE CAKE

(as made by Anne for the Camera Course attendees).
Ingredients
2 medium oranges de pip cut into 8's leave skin on
(I remove just a little of the pith)
2 eggs
$1 / 2$ cup oil
1 cup sugar
$11 / 2$ cups SR flour.

Method

Put oranges, sugar, oil and eggs into food processor and mix well then add flour and mix.
Place in greased, lined ring tin and bake at 180 degrees ( fan forced) for 30 mins.

## Ed Uden passing.

Ed Uden had been a member of SDCUCI for 8 years. His presence tended to be shyly introvert at our meetings, but he took a great interest in our proceedings. He had a disposition that enabled him to converse easily with those around him. His background is very interesting. He undertook general carpentry, cabinet making as an apprentice and over the years became highly skilled in his crafts. Learning these crafts also bought other technical skills to his repertoire. He could pretty well turn his hand to anything. Before coming to Australia in 1961 with his wife Pearl, he was requested to undertake a difficult and demanding cabinet making task on board HMAS Britannia. From all the people available to undertake this work he was selected. A great accolade and achievement for him.

In Ed's case he was surrounded by family; friends and neighbours from Maslin's Beach; from members of his Freemasonry Lodge: from members of various car clubs, from members of SDCUCI. In particular, as a club, we recognise the assistance and help given to both Ed and Pearl by our member and now committee member, Emma Boss as well as that of member, Graham Williams. We thank you on behalf of the club.
