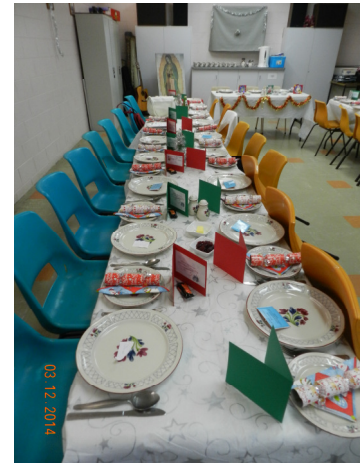

IS IT SAFE TO LET MY BROWSER REMEMBER PASSWORDS ?

Letting your browser remember passwords is a convenient feature. However, it is important to understand that with that convenience comes risk - often significant risk.

If you have **Firefox** remember passwords for you, do the following:

- Click on the **Firefox** icon
- Click on the **Tools** menu
- Click on the **Options** menu item
- Click on the **Security** tab
- Click on the **Saved Passwords** button
- Click on the **Show Passwords** button



Yes, a few clicks and all your passwords are visible, and anyone who gets access to your computer can follow those simple instructions to obtain all your saved passwords. **Scary???**

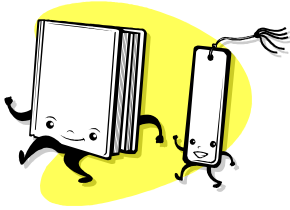
What can you do?

- **Do nothing but rely on physical security** - this means you know that your machine cannot be easily stolen and that no one can walk up to it and access Firefox's remembered password list.
- **Clear the list and stop remembering passwords** - This is the recommended action, or, as an alternative, use **LastPass** which allows you to store your password database and keeps it securely encrypted as well.
- **Use a master password** - Firefox allows you to use an encrypted master password, which in theory, without knowing the password, you cannot access the stored passwords. But, if someone with malicious intent can steal your computer, or Firefox's encrypted files, they still have a reasonable chance of breaking through this security and gaining access to your remembered passwords.

Recommendation: Never use the browser to remember passwords on a computer you don't control completely!

TONIGHT'S MEETING - BACKING UP DATA

The backed up data is a copy of the original data you have made (often over some considerable time) and moved to an entirely separate piece of hardware, either an external hard drive, a USB stick or a CD disk.

Firstly, here are several things one needs to consider before anything can be backed up.

1. What information (files) do I want to back up?
2. Where in my computer are the files that I want backed up?
3. Where am I going to put (and keep) these backed up files?
4. How often should I back up my data files?

It is safe to assume that your computer WILL crash at some point or other.

AND Murphy's Law says it will probably happen with no warning - with no time at the last minute to save the situation. Your data will simply be destroyed or become unavailable in an instant. If you have never done a backup before, this could result in the loss of several years work and effort. You will wish the earth could just swallow you up - especially if the wife or partner has been nagging you about getting it done!

BUT, having a copy of your data on a different drive will save the day!

Tonight, we will hear two ways of achieving a reliable backup - one using a commercial program and Jim showing us how it should be done - manually.

This evening we address the ultra-important subject of backups. There are numerous ways of achieving this and these will be discussed. Just DO IT (before it's too late)!!

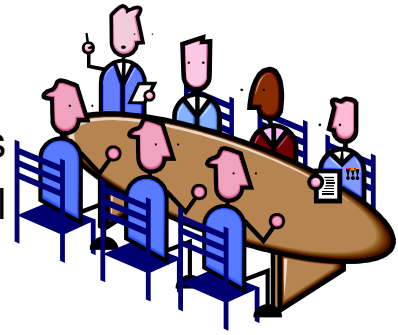

Recipe Corner

Cheese and Bacon Bites



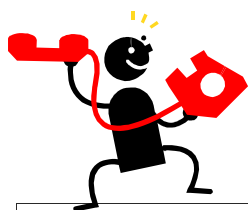
Ingredients:

½ cup milk,
1 egg,
2 cups coarsely grated matured cheese,
3 short bacon rashers, chopped,
2 medium brown onions, or 1 brown and 1 green onion, finely chopped,
1 cup SR Flour,
1 tsp French or grainy mustard,
Pinch of salt,
¼ tsp ground black pepper.

Method:

Beat together milk, egg, mustard, pepper and salt together in a large bowl. Add all other ingredients and mix well. Drop rounded spoonfuls onto a baking paper lined oven tray. Bake in a hot oven for 20 minutes, or until golden brown. If your matured cheese doesn't have much bite, add another ½ tsp of mustard to the mix.

(If Bub remembers - you will sample these with supper tonight)

If you wish to attend any Course, please contact a Committee Member

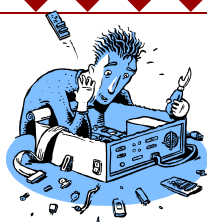
If you have a special request regarding a program, eg Word, Publisher, Excel etc, please let a committee member know. We may be able to schedule a course to suit, sometime in the future.

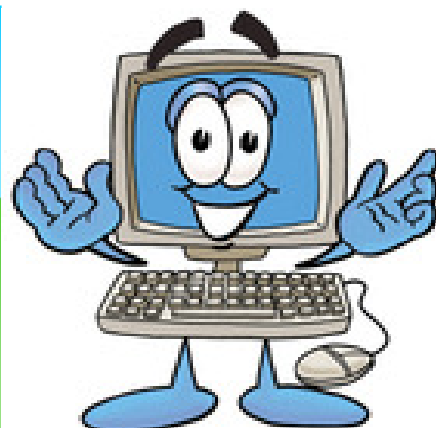
