PRESIDENT'S REPORT


First for the new year!!

BACKING UP YOUR PHOTOS

Do you backup your photos and videos? Everyone with a smartphone has a camera and they are using them to snap photos and shoot videos. A lot of it isn't getting backed up.

As soon as you take a picture or video with a **digital camera**, you have exactly one copy of that photograph (the original on the camera). It is impractical to back it up after every shot

the camera). It is impractical to back it up after every shot, so we do have to accept some amount of time where there is no backup at all. During that time, if you lose the camera, you lose all the photos and videos on it.

AskLeo developed this technique to backup his photos:

- * Take photos throughout the day.
- * At the end of the day, copy these photos/videos to your laptop computer. Again, this is a copy, not a move. After this step, the photos exist in two places.
- * Backup the laptop each night to a portable external hard drive. This results in three copies of your photos. (camera, laptop and backup). Only then is it safe to remove the photos from your camera's memory card.
- * You can take an extra step and remove the memory card from your camera and post it home then put a new blank memory card into your camera.

Smartphones typically have the added convenience of being connected to the internet in some way. We can leverage that to make the copy process not just easier, but possibly completely automatic.

- * Simply email your photos to yourself using an email account you can access online or at your computer.
- * Use cloud storage DropBox, OneDrive etc. These will automatically upload photos and videos as you take them, if you give them permission to do so. Make sure you have enough storage in your online account and make sure the application on your phone has permission to upload your photos.

If you lose access to your account with the cloud storage, you lose the images you have stored.

- * Understand how the app works. Does it leave a copy on your phone too?
- Download your images to your computer as soon as it is possible.

SCAM ALERT

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission is warning holiday makers to watch out for scams on popular accommodation booking sites such as Airbnb.

The ACCC's Scamwatch has received over 150 reports about scams on sharing economy platforms this year, with \$80,000 reported lost. Complaints have tripled from 2015, when there was \$65,000 reported lost to these scams.

"Watch out for scammers advertising accommodation deals in great locations at cheap prices. When you go to book a break, scammers direct you away from the site and ask you to pay them directly using money orders or wire transfer services such as Western Union and MoneyGram," ACCC Deputy Chair Delia Rickard warned.

"Some reports indicate that scammers create very convincing fake versions of the site which they can use to collect personal details and banking information. Be aware that the scammers may send 'confirmation' emails which appear to be official, using a logo or email address that imitates the real thing."

"Never click on links in these emails and don't reply to them. Double check that the URL, website or email address is correct and be aware that links may redirect you towards a fake address that looks similar to the legitimate site," Ms Rickard said.

"Most legitimate websites and peer-to-peer platforms such as Airbnb set up secure payment systems where the operator acts as an intermediary between the traveller and property owner. Paying through the platform's system provides both owners and customers with safeguards such as refunds, cancellation policies and dispute resolution in the event that problems arise."

"Any request for payment to be made via a method other than through the approved payment methods stated on the actual site, should be ignored. If you are directed to pay for accommodation using a payment method outside the on-site payment system, check advice on the official site and report the post to that site," Ms Rickard said.

Google introduced auto backups and has been keeping backups since the introduction of the Marshamallow OS.

The backup is visible in the Google Drive sidebar. It shows the apps and amount of data. Backup includes the device settings, configuration, wallpaper, wifi passwords and default apps.

Also included in the upgrade - easier previews of excel and other spreadsheet tiles.

YAHOO ACCOUNTS HACKED

You will have read (or maybe you haven't) that one billion Yahoo accounts were compromised in 2014. This was after 500 million were compromised in 2013.

Some experts say you should close your Yahoo account.

If your Yahoo account has been compromised, Yahoo will have sent you a security notice.

The type of information compromised includes names, email addresses, telephone numbers, dates of birth, hashed passwords, encrypted and unencrypted security questions and answers.

At the very least, you should change your password.

Yahoo advised they have blocked security questions to the compromised accounts.

MICROSOFT WINDOWS ESSENTIALS 2012 by James Brownpaddock

Microsoft will end support for the Windows Essentials 2012 suite on January 10, 2017

Microsoft will end support for the Windows Essentials 2012 suite on January 10, 2017. If you use any of the suite's component apps—Movie Maker, Photo Gallery, OneDrive, Family Safety, Mail, or Live Writer—here's what you need to know.

Windows Essentials 2012 has been a popular suite of apps since its release, and a surprising number of people still use some of those component apps today. On January 10, 2017, Microsoft will end official support for the suite. You'll still be able to use it, of course, but the apps will no longer receive updates of any kind, including security updates. You also won't be able to download the installer software anymore, either. If you still use Windows Essentials 2012, read on to find out what the end of official support means to you

You Can Keep Using Windows Essentials 2012

and where you can look for alternatives.

Official support for Windows Essentials 2012 will end, but that doesn't mean you have to quit using it. If you've already got it installed, you can keep on using it just like you always have. Just be aware that there will be no future updates, including security updates. For users of Windows Live Mail, having no security updates will matter the most. For the other apps in the suite, it's less important.

If you don't have Windows Essentials 2012 installed and want to install it before January 10, you can still use the live web installer app by clicking "Download Now" on Microsoft's Windows Essentials support page. When you run that installer, you can select which of the component apps in the suite you want to download and install.

If you want to be able to install the suite at any point after January 10, 2017, you should go ahead and download the <u>Windows Essentials 2012 offline installer</u> (that's a direct download link that weighs in at 130 MB). Save it somewhere on your system and you'll be able to install the suite any time you want. There's no guarantee that either of these installers will be available after support ends, so you might as well play it safe and grab a copy of the offline installer now.

You Don't Need to Replace Family Safety and OneDrive

So what if you want to replace Windows Essentials apps with modern equivalents? We'll start with the easy stuff: All the features of the Family Safety app and OneDrive have been built into Windows 8 and 10, so if you use either of those, you're good to go. In fact, if you are using either of those, you won't even get the option to install the Family Safety app along with the suite.

LEFTOVERS PATÉ



Cooked Chicken or Turkey - 1 cup, shredded.

Ham – chopped, ¾ cup

Cream Cheese – 125 g

Chives – 1 Tablespoon, chopped

Chicken Stock - 2 Tablespoons

Butter - 30g melted

In a food processor, combine chicken, ham, cream cheese, chives and stock until smooth.

Spoon evenly among six $\frac{1}{2}$ cup ramekins or 1 larger dish, smoothing surface. Pour a little of the melted butter over each and cover with plastic wrap. Chill at least 1 hour.

Serve pate as part of a ploughman's lunch with crusty bread, cheeses etc, or with dry biscuits and a drink.

If you're using Windows 7, there are <u>Parental Controls</u> built in. They're not quite as fully featured as those that the Family Safety app offered, but they should do most of what you need.

OneDrive is also now built into Windows 8 and 10. If you're using Windows 7, you will need to download the OneDrive app, but it's all new since the one offered in Windows Essentials 2012 and it's continually updated.


