Error Messages in Microsoft Operating Systems

Most PC operators have encountered Error Messages popping up in Microsoft®, sometimes these are easily remedied by looking for the file causing the error and deleting or reinstalling the offending program. Often the error message will mean nothing to the average user. Take a note of the message. Ignore any list of numbers/addresses and copy the text message. Frequently, opening Google and inserting the message as a search string will get answers. Sometimes the answer sites will tell you what to do to fix the problem but after paying a fee.

Microsoft ® have their own very extensive *Knowledge Base* that more often or not, will prove to be most useful in understanding and remedying the Error Message. Go to http://search.support.microsoft.com/search/default.aspx>

At the search page, you can select the Microsoft Software being used, type the error message and the search engine will find a list of Articles that contain the message in priority order. Each article has an Article Number and more often than not, has links to other articles that may be useful.

Getting to know how to use the Knowledge Base is a good skill to master.

MSWord Format:- Indents

In an early Word Processing text book, I read that the "PC is not a typewriter". The use of the TAB key is one of the major differences. Using the Tab Key to indent is usually untidy, upsets page Justification and makes it difficult to edit later. Instead, use the Ruler Bar Indent Markers, those two little triangular markers, the WP tab stops. By default, Word sets the Left and Right margin and the top Ruler shows you the print area (and thus typing space) of the paper. The ruler numbers are the default TAB stops and this will be where the TAB key sends the curser for text entry. However, by highlighting a line or paragraph and then holding the curser on the markers, you can drag the marker to where ever you need. Top left marker is for the 1st line, bottom for the whole paragraph indent. The little rectangle drags both, Try it!



To add more functionality to Windows XP visit the Microsoft PowerToys web page. There you will find handy gadgets that can do everything from provide previews of windows whilst using ALT + Tab to providing access to up to four different desktops on the same computer!

Turning On Picture Placeholders: (MSWord Tips from the net)

If you are working with a document that has quite a few graphics, and you don't have the latest and greatest fast computer, you have probably noticed that Word slows down quite a bit when displaying the graphics. This can be particularly distracting, especially if your graphics are quite detailed. You can speed up the display of your document by using picture placeholders. This results in Word displaying boxes where your graphics would normally appear. This means that Word does not have to redisplay the complete graphic, and therefore your display will be much faster. To turn on picture placeholders, follow these steps:

- 1. Choose Options from the Tools menu. You will see the Options dialog box.
- 2. Make sure the View tab is selected. Use the Picture Placeholders check box to control whether picture placeholders are used by Word.
- 3. Click on the check box to turn the capability on and off; if the box is selected it means picture placeholders are enabled.
- 4. Click on OK.

Have you been vaccinated against Influenza yet?

The flu season is again upon us, and older people and those who are ill are being urged to get their annual vaccination to protect against the coming flu season.

Health Minister John Hill said those who have a higher risk of infection are at the greatest risk. "People should be getting their flu shots now, not waiting until the colder weather hits," he said.

"Influenza has the potential to hit hard every winter, and people who are considered at risk — those with chronic diseases like diabetes or heart and lung problems, and older people — are particularly vulnerable

Flu vaccine is free for people over 65 years of age, who I would urge to take up this offer for free vaccination. Older people should contact their GP for further information or to arrange a vaccination _and while the vaccination itself is free, they will still need to pay the usual fee or gap payment for a doctors' visit. The SA Health Department also recommends people in nursing homes and long-term care facilities are vaccinated, including health care workers who have contact with people in high-risk groups.

Did you know?

As Britain was unable to import Coal during World War II, the production of coal from mines in Britain had to be increased. To meet this need it was decided by the Minister of Labour Ernest Bevin, that a percentage of young men called up to serve in the forces should work in the mines. From 1943 to the end of the war one in ten of the young men called up were sent to work in the mines. This caused a great deal of upset as the many of the young men wanted to join the fighting forces and many felt that they were not valued. These conscript miners were given the nickname 'Bevin Boys'. Many suffered taunts as they wore no uniform and were wrongly assumed to be avoiding serving in the armed forces. Many were not released from their work until several years after the war ended, long after their counterparts in the armed forces had returned to civilian life.

The program was demobilised in 1948. Bevin Boys returning from service received no medals, nor did they have the right to return to the jobs they had at the beginning of the war, unlike other servicemen. The Bevin Boys were not fully recognized for their service until 1995, 50 years after VE Day, in a speech by Queen Elizabeth II. On Wednesday 20 June 2007 Tony Blair informed the House of Commons during Prime Ministers Question time that the thousands of conscripts who worked down coalmines in World War II would receive a special honour. The prime minister told the Commons the "Bevin Boys" would be rewarded with a **Commemorative Badge**.
