What's happening in 2015

Windows 10 - Microsoft announced pricing for Windows 10. While it will be free for users to upgrade within 12 months of the release date, if you decide you want to upgrade after 12 months, it will cost \$156 for Windows 10 home , Pro version \$262. Upgrading to the Pro version will cost \$130

Concerned about your privacy? We all know Google collect your search information to sell to marketing companies so you can be targeted with their adverts. Microsoft offers users of Bing (its search engine) the ability to encrypt search information, and by the end of the year, your search information will be encrypted by default. Microsoft says it cares about consumers privacy more than marketers.

TONIGHT'S MEETING - LINUX & OPEN OFFICE

This month's meeting we will be looking at the similarities and differences between the giant Microsoft Operating system that is expensive (ie Windows XP, Windows 7, 8 etc.) **and an entirely FREE one**, which, at first glance, one would be hard pressed to tell the difference.

We are talking about an operating system called LINUX which is a **free** shareware program that mimics Windows in all but a few facets.

When Linux is installed, it automatically includes an email package (Thunderbird) and a web browser (Firefox).

Linux was originally developed as a free operating system for personal computers, based on the Intel x86 architecture, but has since been ported to more computer hardware platforms than any other operating system.

Open Office (Openoffice.org) is able to read and write Microsoft Office files. It can open and save Word, Excel and PowerPoint files on several platforms (Windows, Linux, Mac OS x, Solaris).

We hope you enjoy Jim's presentation tonight and feel free to discuss Linux with him during supper..


INHERITANCE EMAIL SCAN

Last Month's meeting— APPS

The June meeting was well attended, with around 38 souls braving the cold night air. We were delighted to welcome **Gundi Schuetz** as a new member, and were equally pleased to have four visitors— Pat and Dez Clarke, and Gloria and Hoss Janssen.

President Lionel opened the meeting then handed the mike over to Trevor Francis who proceeded to enlighten us with explanations of 'apps' that have been installed on the club tablet.

NB: Trevor was able to actually face the members for his presentation thanks to a small connector, a long lead, and once again, our talented gurus.

He explained how to move from screen to screen using his finger as a 'slider'. He then explained the various icons and buttons.

Question: What is the difference between an "App" and a "Program".



Answer: **NOTHING!** However, with a computer, one usually 'downloads' a program from a site on the net, then you install it. With a tablet this is a seamless operation. You visit an app store, (Playstore) download it and it automatically installs and creates an icon that is ready for use.

He discussed device selection, spoke about apps that are already installed, and security.

Trevor then took us on a tour of a typical 'digital' day in his busy life, showing us how he uses his apps.

He divides his apps into 4 categories:

Social - e-mail, Web, Facebook and other things that bring pleasure and are useful to have at your fingertips.

Photographic—Things like Camera, VLC , apps for images and recording.

Games - Literally thousands of them, ranging from "shoot-em-ups", to mind improvement and loads more topics.

Office Usage.- Things like Microsoft Office package: Word, Excel, Powerpoint etc, plus many more office type categories..

Once again, a most informative, entertaining and useful topic. Thankyou Trevor for all the work put into this presentation.


