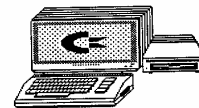

Our last meeting — Windows 8

We had a good attendance at our **February 2013** meeting. Jim Greenfield gave an excellent demonstration on Windows 8.

Some points made were:

- The original Windows 1 came about in November 1985 with many changes during the years including Vista, Window XP etc, and now Windows 8 being released in October 2012.
- Windows 8 has laid the groundwork for modular computing—a single device that transforms to suit user's need, eg tablets.
- Dean advised us of a new program which would install a “start Button/Menu on Windows 8”. Jim has installed this on his computer with excellent results.
- Following is the article submitted by Dean:

INSTALLING A START BUTTON / MENU ON WINDOWS 8 (written by Dean)

My new Window 8 computer with its Metro Start Screen uses lots of tiles to display programs and features on the start screen. This may be great if using a touch screen computer, but I am not, and I found it both time consuming and somewhat hard to understand. I wanted something that was fast and easy to use (or understand) so I researched the web and found a program (Classic Shell) which meets my needs.

The Classic Shell project started back in 2008 and the first public version was released in Nov 2009 and was used by many people on their Vista computers.

What does Classic Shell do? It is a collection of features that were available in older versions of Windows but removed in newer versions. It will install a ‘Start Menu’ and other features if you want/need them.

I suggest only installing the Classic Start menu and not the other two programs that are part of the package. After downloading the program, take time to study the “Read Me” file that comes with it. You can then make up your mind if you need the other features or not. Also in the “Read Me” file is a lot of information on both installing and/or uninstalling the programs.

The program can be downloaded from: **<http://classicshell.sourceforge.net/>** and the one installer will work with both 32 and 64 bit systems.

I have installed it on three new computers and if you want to make your copy of Windows 8 look and operate like XP and/or Windows 7, I suggest you consider this program. And it is FREE.

Audacity is a free, easy to use and multilingual audio editor and recorder for Windows, Mac OS X, GNU/Linux and other operating systems. You can use Audacity to:

- Record live audio through microphone or mixer, or digitize recordings from cassette tapes, records or minidisks. With some sound cards, Audacity can also capture streaming audio.
- Convert tapes and records into digital recordings or CD's.
- Import sound files, edit them and combine them with other files or new recordings.
- Edit and mix large numbers of tracks.
- Cut, copy, splice or mix sounds together.
- Change the speed or pitch of a recording.
- And more!

WHAT IS THE CLOUD?

Recipe Corner

Sticky Date Cake with Caramel Sauce

Ingredients

250g pitted dates, chopped
1 teaspoon bi-carb soda
1½ cups boiling water
125g butter, softened
¾ cup brown sugar
2 eggs, at room temperature
2 cups self raising flour, sifted



Caramel Sauce

1 cup brown sugar
300 ml thickened cream
60g butter, chopped

Method :

Preheat the oven to 180°C. Grease a 7 cm deep, 22 cm (base) cake pan and line with baking paper.

Place dates and bi-carb soda in a heatproof bowl. Pour over boiling water. Allow to stand uncovered for 20 mins or until dates are tender.

Using an electric mixer, beat butter and sugar until pale and creamy, add eggs, 1 at a time, beating well after each addition. Using a large metal spoon, stir in date mixture and flour. Mix until well combined.

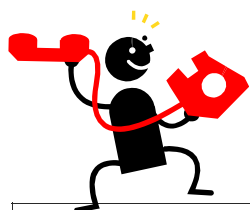
Spoon mixture into cake pan. Bake for 40-45 mins or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Stand for 10 mins before turning onto a wire rack.

Make caramel sauce: Combine sugar, cream and butter in a saucepan over medium heat. Cook stirring for 3 mins or until boiling. Reduce heat to low and simmer for 2 mins. Pour warm sauce over warm cake.

Cut in to wedges and serve. Cake and sauce can be made up to 2 days in advance. Store cake in foil-lined, airtight container and store the sauce in an airtight container in the fridge.

Do you have any old computers you feel you could offer to an overseas charity organisation?

If so read on!

A container is being organised to go to the Democratic Republic of Congo. It will contain medical & hospital supplies and also computers.



The computers are needed to run the administration of a hospital and for schools that are being set up to train children in the Republic of the Congo.

Any old working computers including laptops, screens etc. would be gratefully accepted.

This charity mission is called "Mission in Health Care and Development" and is run by a Dr Luc Mulimbalimba Masururu. Dr Luc is a trained Medical Doctor and Medical Director of two hospitals in the Congo.

He is also a Member of the Congo Parliament and Pastor of a Church of 2,000. He has already trained over 500 birth attendants, built a hospital and has distributed over seventy thousand (70,000) birthing kits.

He also has links with Rotary Australia and any monetary donations made will be tax deductible.

The Australian organisers estimate they have about 3 months to prepare a large transport container to go to the Congo. Our nearest drop off is Camden Park.
