Last month's meeting - Broadband and NBN

We were greeted by a PowerPoint presentation of beautiful animals and birds along with soothing music while waiting for our meeting to start. A good turnout again, with 1 visitor - Sandra McLachlan and 1 new member - **Margie O'Connor.** Welcome!

After stepping on the speaker cord which caused a loud horrible noise, our talk from **John Kirby** got under way.

Some points on Broadband:

- John gave a brief overview of his work with the State Government NBN
- All state regional areas only had Telstra which was expensive and not good.
- Uses 2.6 mtr wide dishes on towers for microwave capacity to Adelaide.
- More efficiency, lower cost and better service
- WiMax wireless antenna in Reynella to help with black spots
- Maggea Tower (Berri) Is 90 mtr high & took a full day to put up
- Will get increased efficiency and bandwidth
- Ability for indigenous clinics to link to hospitals and GP's
- All Government agencies connected.
- NBN Established 2009.
- New construction will be fibre to the node (box at road) then copper to the house.
- Fibre is approximately 5mm across.
- May not be available for 2-4 years depending on area with fibre node.
- Limited performance depending on quality of copper.
- At the moment, no cost to have NBN installed.

Ed: We certainly did not realise NBN was such a complex procedure

MOORE'S LAW - INTEL CO-FOUNDER, GORDON MOORE


In 1965, a California scientist noted that the number of transistors that could be crammed onto an integrated circuit was doubling about every year. Fifty years

later, Moore's Law explains why digital cameras are equal to film, smart phones are so amazing and self-driving cars are coming soon.

Gordon Moore, now a scientist emeritus at chip-maker, Intel, described a trend and ended up pushing an entire industry to ever greater heights.

Now 86, Moore says the notion of his law came about when Electronics Magazine asked him to predict what the future would look like in the transistor industry.

At the time, Moore worked for Fairchild Semiconductor in Mountain View, California. He looked at the chips they were making and saw they had eight transistors on them, but the new chips coming out had about 16. In Fairchild's



laboratories, scientists were working on 30 and even 60 transistor chips.

Moore took a piece of graph paper and plotted these numbers out. That simple act showed him the capacity of the chips was doubling every year, Moore told an Intel staffer in an interview conducted in January.

"So I took a wild extrapolation and said we are going to continue doubling every year and go from about 60 elements at the time to 60,000 in 10 years," he said. The article was published on April 19th, 1965.

In 1975 he updated it to predict that chip capacity would double every two years. That number had been relatively steady ever since. Every decade or so someone says the physical limits of increase are upon us, but so far engineers have found ways to keep making chips smaller, faster and more powerful.

Moore was clear that he wasn't describing a physical constant like the law of gravity but simply observing what was happening in the world of transistors. Thankfully for computer users everywhere, his extrapolation has taken on the weight of law. Technology companies began to act as if they had to keep on track with doubling processing ability or they would be seen as falling behind. Moore ended up setting the pace as much as describing it.

So the next time you pick up your phone to do something even the most farthinking computer scientists couldn't conceive of 50 years ago, take a moment to thank Gordon Moore and his simple graph.

As Intel notes, if you tried to build an Android phone today using the chips available in 1971, it would be the size of a parking space.



WHY SHOULDN'T I USE THE "REPORT SCAM" OR "JUNK" BUTTON?

The "Report Scam" and "Junk" links serve an important function in the war against spam. However, used improperly, they can do much more harm than good.

The concept behind buttons like **Junk** in Hotmail; **Spam** in Yahoo Mail; **Report Spam** in Google's Gmail, and similar buttons in different mailers is simple - let users decide what is and is not spam and then use that information to build a better spam filter. Spam is notoriously difficult to identify, but the theory goes that "you know it when you see it." As more and more people tell the mail services, "This is spam," these services can then use various characteristics of that mail to make their spam

filters better.



Unfortunately, the flaw in this scenario is the users. As it turns out, they often do not know spam when they see it and report legitimate mail as spam. If enough people do that, then eventually legitimate mail starts getting blocked by spam filters. You and others cannot get the mail that you asked for because

it was reported as spam.

"Report as scam" is not a substitute for "Unsubscribe". If you want to stop receiving emails, then the thing to do is hit the unsubscribe link. Because you asked for this email and confirmed you want it, the right thing to do is to follow the directions to unsubscribe from it.

If you use the "Report as Spam" button, you are harming both the publisher of that email (newsletter) and the other subscribers. How?

Because you have told the mailer that it is spam when it is not. The mailer may eventually start blocking that email, not only from you but from other recipients using the same service.



If you asked for the mail, then use the proper steps to unsubscribe. If you *know* you did not, if you *know* that what you are looking at is truly spam (unsolicited email) then by all means report it as spam.

RECIPE

DUKKAH

INGREDIENTS:

(Makes 1½ cups)


- 110g (²⁄₃ cup) hazelnuts
- 80g (1/2 cup) sesame seeds
- 2 tbs coriander seeds
- 2 tbs cumin seeds
- 2 tsp freshly ground black pepper
- 1tsp flaked sea salt (like Maldon brand)
- Extra virgin olive oil, to serve
- Crusty bread to serve



Preparation: 10min >

Cook: 5min >





- Place the toasted hazelnuts in the bowl of a food processor and process until coarsely chopped. Transfer to a large bowl.
- Heat a medium frying pan over medium heat. Add the sesame seeds and cook, stirring, for 1-2 mins or until golden. Add to the bowl with the hazelnuts.
- Place coriander seeds and cumin seeds in frying pan over medium heat and cook, stirring frequently, for 1-2 mins or until aromatic and seeds begin to pop. Transfer seeds to a mortar and pestle. Pound until finely crushed (alternatively, use a coffee or spice grinder). Add the crushed spices, pepper and salt to the hazelnut mixture.
- Serve dukkah with some extra virgin olive oil and crusty bread.

Store Dukkah in an airtight container at room temperature - is real yummy when used instead of breadcrumbs for coating chicken or fish.


