Dean's Apple Sour Cream Slice

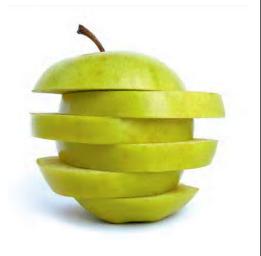
Ingredients. 1 pkt. Plain or Vanilla Cake Mix. 1 Cup Coconut. 4 ozs. Melted Butter. 1 egg. 1 ctn. Sour Cream (300ml). Stewed Apple. (I use tinned Pie Apple). Cinnamon.

Method.

Mix cake Mix with Coconut and melted Butter. Press into slice tin lined with non-stick baking paper. Bake at 200c for 10 mins.

Place cooked Apple on top of Slice. Beat egg and Sour cream until thick and creamy. Pour over Apples. Sprinkle with Cinnamon. Bake for a further 20-30mins. Chill in frig.



WASTE RESET UTILITY

I have an Epson R230 printer with an external rihac Continuous Inking System fitted. About 3 weeks ago I refilled the containers and had a slight problem with an airlock in one of the tubes. After fiddling around and clearing the blockage and cleaning the heads to get the ink to flow properly an error panel appeared saying that some parts on the printer needed service attention. I ignored this and continued to clean the heads. A few minutes later the printer stopped and all lights were flashing. I couldn't get the ink tanks out to see what was happening, so frustrated, I turned it off and left it.

I was contemplating what to do – not wanting to take it for repair as a new printer would probably be cheaper. I rang Inkjet Printer and spoke to Ian and asked him if there was another Epson Printer Model that would suit my external system – NO was the answer and then he asked me what the problem was and I told him the drama.

He said go and google *Waste Reset Utility* and reset my ink counter ??????

So with very little information I went onto Google and put in Epson R230 Waste Reset Utility. Up came a website with a forum page with lots of queries and answers. After a bit of searching I found a site and downloaded a free program called *SSC SERVICE UTILITY*. <u>http://inkjetprinterhelp.us/epsonSSC.html</u> I installed the program and then walked through the instructions supplied on the same page.

I DON'T KNOW HOW IT WORKED but the lights stopped flashing and I was then able to fine tune the head cleaning and now my printer is up and running – working perfectly. *GOOD OLD GOOGLE !!!!*

Safe Mode

When and why to use the Safe Mode when starting your computer:

Safe Mode is used to start your computer if for some reason you are unable to start in the normal Windows. It may also be used when you do Scan Disk and/or Disk Defragmenter as it automatically turns off all running programs.

In safe mode, Windows uses default settings (VGA monitor; no network; no Microsoft mouse drive; and the minimum device drivers required to start Windows). You may not be able to access the CD-ROM drives, printers, or other devices.

To start Windows in safe mode:

From the task bar, left click the Start button, then left click Shut Down. (Safe Mode can also be accessed from an 'off' computer in the same way).

From the "Turn Off" box, select and left click the "Restart" command, and then left click the "OK" button.

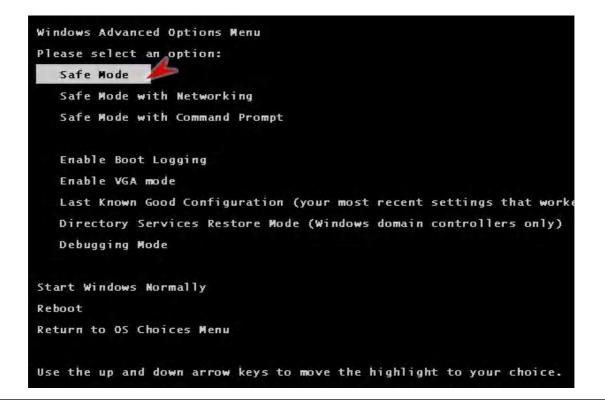
IMMEDIATELY the first words appear on the screen, press and hold down the F8 key (located at the top of the keyboard) until Microsoft Windows Startup Menu appears. The screen will fill with white words on a black screen for some seconds, before continuing.

Use the arrow keys to select Safe Mode, and then press Enter on the keyboard.

Once you have pressed Enter, it may take a couple of minutes for your computer to restart in the Safe Mode. When restarted in Safe Mode you will see the "Desktop". This will be black. Read the information and then left click "OK". (Note the words "Safe mode" at each corner of your monitor).

From this point on you can use your computer, but as previously stated you will not be able to use a printer, CD ROM, scanners etc. But, Safe Mode is the time to run Scan Disk and Disk Defragmenter as all other programs have been turned off.

After you have finished running the computer in Safe Mode, you need to restart your computer before Windows will start properly. Once restarted you will be able to use your printer, scanners etc. as normal.
