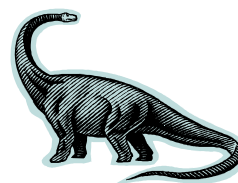

GENERAL BUSINESS

1) The details that needed to be altered in the free add in the Computer Market magazine has been done by Jeff. i.e. Contact phone number.

2) A new Public Officer had to be elected. Rob was suggested. A copy to be sent to the Corporate Affairs Commission and a copy to be held in clubs records. Moved by Jim, 2nd by Jan. Carried.

3) John Buckingham from Commodore Network is to be notified of the clubs changes.

4) Due to the club presently having no keys to the P.O. Box, Rohan wrote an authorization letter for Jim to approach the Morphett Vale Post Office and have the lock changed and new keys issued.

Tonight we will learn about computer and device security. A subject that should be taken seriously.

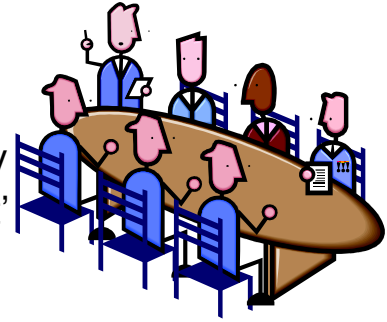
You are reminded that your tickets to the Christmas Party should be purchased tonight. We hope to see you on 3rd December.

Recipe Corner

Cheat's Butter Chicken



Ingredients:

- 1 tbs oil
- 1kg chicken thigh fillets, fat trimmed, cut in half
- 1 tbs butter
- 2 cloves garlic, crushed
- 2 tbs bottled tandoori curry paste
- 420g can fat-free condensed tomato soup
- ½ cup low-fat, thick natural yoghurt
- ½ cup reduced fat cream
- Coriander leaves to garnish

Method:

1. Heat fat in heavy based pan until hot. Stir chicken in batches for 2-3 minutes until golden, transferring to a plate as it cooks.
2. Reduce heat; add butter to pan.
3. Add garlic and curry paste, stir for 30 seconds until fragrant.
4. Stir through soup, yogurt and cream. Return chicken and juices to pan.
5. Simmer, stirring occasionally, for 10-15 minutes until chicken is tender and sauce thickens slightly.
6. Sprinkle with coriander and serve with rice and broccoli.

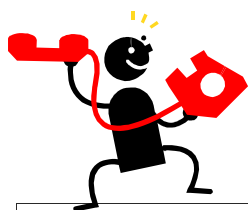

Security covers all the processes and mechanisms by which computer-based equipment, information and services are protected from unintended or unauthorized access, change or destruction. Computer security also includes protection from unplanned events and natural disasters.

DID YOU KNOW ABOUT HOME BROADBAND DATA TOP-UP?

Telstra home broadband customers on plans/bundles which are slowed down upon reaching 100% of the monthly data allowance, are eligible to use **Home Broadband Data Top-Ups** on ADSL, Cable, Velocity and NBN technologies.

If you are approaching or have reached your plan's monthly data allowance, you can request a data top-up. Eligible customers have 3 Top-Ups available per calendar year at no additional cost. A top-up gives you another month's data allowance to use until the end of your current billing month, and returns your service to normal speeds.

Once requested, it typically takes up to 30 minutes to activate and return your broadband to normal speed.

To request the top-up, call Telstra on 132 200 or visit a Telstra Store. Alternatively, they do have a Live Chat Agent which can be accessed via their website.

DID YOU KNOW?

NO WINDOWS 9 - BUT THERE IS A WINDOWS 10

Nearly everyone, including many of the experts, were caught expecting the next Microsoft operating system to be version 9. Its history now, as we know it will be named Windows 10.;

- ☺ A beta version is available if you want to be part of Windows 10 development.
- ☺ The official release of Windows 10 is mid 2015.
- ☺ A feature will be two factor authentication for laptops and tablets.
- ☺ It will work by registering a trusted device that can be connected via WiFi or Bluetooth. With the use of a pin or fingerprint, you can register all your devices as trusted hardware.

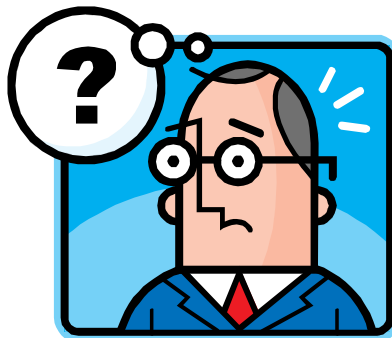

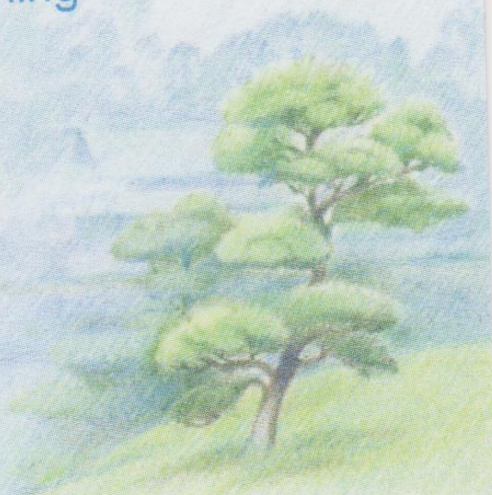
