

# Our last meeting— Swipe Cards and LED's

Jim opened the meeting with a demonstration of the use of **Fox It** instead of Adobe Reader. This program has a smaller footprint which takes less time to download. It will read a document out loud which is especially good for the visually impaired.

**Swipe Cards** - Jim explained some of the downfalls of these cards which scan from a chip (RFID) instead of swiping your card. Any card or passport can have this chip. A credit card reader (readily available over the internet) can scan your card directly from your wallet, handbag or clothes and then copies information to be used fraudulently. Best way to protect yourself is:

- Put a metal protector (or foil) over your card.
- Buy a metal wallet to keep your cards in (cost between \$5—\$10)
- Visit www.snopes.com/fraud/identity/pickpocket.asp
- **LED's** Robert Cloosterman (a founding life member, former President for 7 years, former Secretary and Treasurer for 2 years and former Committee Member 12 years) gave a talk about LED's. Some points made:



- LED's (Light Emitting Diodes) have been around for many years. The first was red, orange and yellow then green, blue and white were produced over a period of years.
- They are very reliable and cheaper to produce and last for 50,000 hours or more.
- In household use, they are a lot cheaper to run than standard 240v globes and can run on 12v. Dust accumulating on the back of old globes can cause fires—this hazard is greatly reduced highly with LED's.
- They are not hot to touch even after being on for a long time.
- They do not work with touch lamps, motion sensors or dimmers need LED compliant. Can get LED fluorescent lights.
- 1 watt LED is equal to 7½ watt of standard globes.

# Downloadable eBooks

The City of Onkaparinga now offer a large collection of downloadable eBooks and audiobooks including classic releases, non-fiction and bestsellers.

You can now download eBooks and eAudio via your compatible eReader, iPad, Smart Phone, MP3 Player, PC and laptop. Before you get started you will need:

- A valid library card
- Internet access (free WiFi available at council library).
- A compatible eReader or computer (Kindle are not currently compatible with the overdrive library in Australia due to Amazon licensing issues).
- An Adobe ID for use with Adobe Digital Editions and eAudiobooks.
- For smart devices such as phones and tablets, apps are available for both the Apple IOS and Android operating systems.

The eBook and AudioBook collection has a limit of 10 items per customer which expire at the end of the due date. The default loan period is 21 days.

The Open Access collection has thousands of titles that don't expire or count toward your 6 eBook limit.

# Recipe Corner

#### Orange jelly jack o' lanterns

#### Ingredients

2 x 85g packets raspberry jelly crystals

6 large oranges



#### **Method**

Make jelly following packet directions. Pour into a medium bowl and refrigerate for 15 minutes or until cool but not set.

Meanwhile, using a small sharp knife, cut a 3cm slice from top of oranges. Cut a very thin slice, making sure not to cut through the pith, from the base of each orange so that it sits flat. Using a spoon, scoop flesh from oranges, leaving only the white pith and the rind. Cut a zigzag pattern around the top edge of each orange.

Place oranges on a tray. Pour enough jelly to fill each orange. At this point, fresh fruit (eg strawberries) can be added to the jelly. Refrigerate for 3 hours or until jelly has set.

Using a small, sharp knife, cut eyes and nose from the front of each orange, making sure you remove the rind and pith, but don't cut into the jelly. Serve topped with orange top.

Halloween is thought to have originated with the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain, when people would light bonfires and wear costumes to ward off roaming ghosts. In the 8th Century, Pope Gregory III designated November 1 as a time to honour all saints and martyrs: All Saints Day. The evening before was known as All Hallows Eve and later Halloween. Over time, Halloween evolved into a community based event characterized by child-friendly activities such as trick or treating.

Neither of us were cajoled, bribed or coerced into taking on this monthly task - we volunteered and so far have not regretted doing so for one moment.








