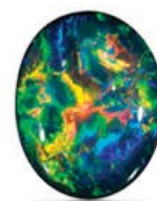

It was then Trevor's turn to give us a talk on Emails and Thunderbird.

There are three ways of accessing your email.

**1. Use a third party email program with direct ISP access.** Eg Thunderbird. You can access already retrieved emails without being on the net. No sign in or password necessary after initial installation and received emails are always available.

**2. Use your ISP's inbuilt web set up.** Use a search engine to look for your ISP (eg Adam Internet, [www.adam.com.au](http://www.adam.com.au)). Once located, look within that page to find how to access their web based email system.

**3. Use a mainstream web browser.** Eg Google (gmail.com), Yahoo (yahoo.com.au) Microsoft (outlook.com) If computer crashes, no emails are lost - they are in the Cloud.

Email programs have common functions, but different names and different places on the screen. Eg, fields, files and contacts.



It is free and easy to download Thunderbird and I believe Trevor gave out instruction fliers. It has automatic updates and very easy to use as it has remained stable since it began. Their parent company is Mozilla Firefox.

## **The Dangers of USB Drives.** (as seen on Ch7 Today Tonight)

USB Flash Drives are an extremely popular way for people to store data on, but they can come with hidden dangers as was recently discovered by Channel 7 in Adelaide that bought one from an office supply store.

This USB flashdrive came with three pieces of malware on it that originated from a foreign country.



This malware was a worm that would spread across any computer/network that it was connected to, and change your Search Engine and redirect you to other malicious sites which will install more programs on your computer. This malware will also cause numerous pop-ups and error messages.

From this your computer can become a “botnet” used to transmit malware across the internet as well as transmitting what you do back to the makers of the malware.

So what can you do?

When you buy a USB drive, format the drive, that means wiping the drive of any data.

Make sure you have a good antivirus, Windows Defender on Windows 10 was the only antivirus that immediately identified the malware and removed it.

## TREASURERS REPORT



I am very happy to report that the Computer Club is in a much better financial position with a book balance of \$8,120.76. At this time last year the book balance was \$5,302.09. This has been in a large part due to fund raising activities by the committee, their families and you, the Club members.

We have had three sausage sizzles this year. We had two at the Bunnings Noarlunga store and another one at the Onkaparinga Leisure Centre. The total profit from these 3 events was \$1,649.45. We also made a small profit from the Christmas Dinner of \$256.71 and the profit from the monthly raffles was \$178.32. Total profit from fund raising activities was \$2,084.48.

Without the fundraising, the receipts for the year would have been \$2,347.93 and the payments would have been \$1,676.74. On the surface this looks a very good result. However, this year we have not had to replace any equipment. The Secretary's printer is reaching its "use by" date and he has been shopping around for the best price to replace it. Replacement costs vary from \$240 to \$900 but it is the cost of the consumables that we need to be aware of.

Membership has remained static this year. At the end of last year, we had 35 single members, 16 family members - a total 67 members plus 5 life members. At the end of this year, by coincidence, we have the same make up of members. We have lost some members through illness, death and those moving away from the area and we have had new members join.

A huge big thank you to all the committee members, family of committee members and club members who gave of their time to work at the Sausage Sizzles. Also a big thank you to all those who helped with last year's Christmas dinner.



Again I would like to thank Marg Smith for helping out on the desk each month and when I was away on holidays. She does a great job of selling the raffle tickets.

The committee wishes to give a huge thank you to two committee members who are not seeking re-election for the coming year.

Jo Berkin has provided insight and forward thinking comments at our regular monthly meetings. These have assisted us in making decisions, good decisions, concerning the club. We thank you Jo for this and for your assistance at club meeting nights. We have appreciated your input greatly.

## File compression

Used to reduce file size of one or more files, file compression can result in a space saving of 50% to 90% less disk space than the original file/s.

So if you have a lack of space on your hard drive, or you want to conserve space in the cloud with OneDrive, Google Drive or Dropbox, file compression is a consideration.

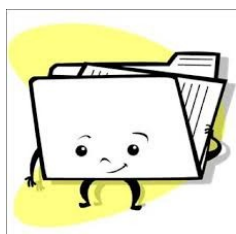
To compress files in Windows:  
Go to *Windows Explorer* or *File Explorer*.

Right click one or more files.  
Select *Send To*, then *Compressed (zipped folder)*.  
Delete originals which then leaves the zipped archive.

Note: Some files like system files should not be compressed.

To save space on the cloud, compress files before uploading or syncing to your cloud storage.

Editor: there are risks in using file compression and Microsoft recommends using it as a last resort.



## GOOGLE DRIVE IS BEING REPLACED

Google has announced that effective 11th December, Google Drive will be replaced by Backup and Sync. While there doesn't appear to be any change to the 15GB of free storage, if you are a G suite customer there are important changes.

Google will stop supporting the Google Drive app on PC's & Mac's and by 12th March 2018, will stop working. Consumers will then have to use Backup and Sync.

For Android and iPads/iPhones, the Google Drive app will not be affected.

Business customers subscribing to Google G Suite apps will be shifted to Drive File Stream. A preview app is now available.

### Backup and Sync features

- Access files in My Drive
- Sync selected folders in MyDrive
- Use native Windows applications, ie Microsoft Word and Adobe Photoshop.
- Sync local folders, ie Documents or desktop.

Drive File Stream does almost the same as Backup and Sync except it does not sync local folders.

Another important difference is it appears as a mounted drive under Windows Explorer. Backup and Sync displays MyDrive as a shortcut.



## iTunes major upgrade

Apple has made major changes in iTunes version 12.7 which may not please everybody. Reduced functionality with no ability to find, download and control apps. Apps can now only be found via iOS devices, such as iPad and iPhone. Ringtones



have gone. Internet radio is now in the podcasts area.

Will these changes affect you?

## FACEBOOK - MAKE NEW FRIENDS

Facebook is testing features that will show more of what you have in common with new potential friends.



At the same time they will make sure you don't forget your old friends.

One feature looks closely at your friend's friends, the places you visited at the same time, if you were working at the same place, events you were both at and things you have both liked on Facebook.

Unknown when these features will be available, but if you are into Facebook you may end up with some new friends.

Works by using boards, lists and cards to organise and prioritize projects. Its flexible. Available as an app in the Apple and Google play stores, and a browser extension.



# SCAM ALERT

I have recently been trying to sell our CamperVan and placed an ad in the Trading Post. On the same day, I received an SMS from an unknown number asking if the van was still available, what was the price and could I please email them back with the information as they were unable to email me direct due to lack of internet coverage. The email address was *manbabe@axo.com*. This email address rang some bells, but thought I would contact them regardless, which I did.



I received a reply almost immediately advising they would buy the van at my requested price and would send someone down to collect it as they worked in a mine near Darwin. More bells rang so I googled ScamWatch and confirmed it was surely a scam.

There has also been a scam where the scammers ring your phone (usually a mobile) and hang up within 1 ring. When you see you missed a call, you call it back. Careful!!! If you ring back it could cost you. The best thing to do is google search the phone number via [reverseaustralia.com](http://reverseaustralia.com) (there are also other sites just as good)

## CCLEANER HACKED WITH MALWARE

September 18th, 2017

A **CCleaner** version that was available for download during the period 15th August and 12th September was compromised and hacked to distribute the **Floxif malware**.



According to Piriform, its developers, the affected versions were **CCleaner v5.33.6162** and **CCleaner Cloud v1.07.3191**.

Piriform (the developers of CCleaner which was bought by Avast) said:

“A suspicious activity was identified on September 12th, 2017 where we saw an unknown IP address receiving data from software found in the above versions of CCleaner on 32-bit Windows systems. Based on further analysis, we found the versions were illegally modified before released to the public and we started an investigation process. We also immediately contacted law enforcement units and worked with them on resolving the issue.”

This incident was found by Talos:

Talos recently observed a case where the download servers used by software vendor to distribute a legitimate software package were leveraged to deliver malware to unsuspecting victims. For a period of time, the legitimate signed version of CCleaner 5.33 being distributed by Avast also contained a multi-stage malware payload that rode on top of the installation of CCleaner.

**CCleaner** has over 2 billion downloads worldwide, and so the impact of this attack could be severe. So if you are using this version, we recommend that you **uninstall it** from your computer asap and **update** to the latest version which is currently **v5.34**. Having done this, make sure you **scan your full computer** with your antivirus software.

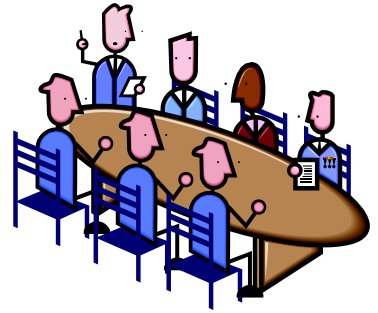
**Piriform** is not aware of, nor speculating how the unauthorized code appeared in the software, where the attack originate from, how long it was being prepared and who stood behind it.
