To start the ball rolling, Trevor and Jim screened a short video on handy hints for your computer.

Other questions/answers were:

- Turn your laptop into a television with TV Tuner, available from Dick Smith for approx \$40. Then all you need is a USB port and a television antenna/aerial.
- Long time member/life member, Bob Cloosterman, is the proud owner of a Mercedes Smart Car and has found that having the car serviced is VERY expensive. So he has purchased an electronic diagnostic problem finder that most mechanics use these days on our computerised vehicles, together with a programme on how to use it and carry out home maintenance on his vehicle. A clever man who is saving himself a small fortune in repairs. His little car is very comfortable and economic, travelling 600kms on a 30ltr fuel tank.

SCAMS

"Blackmail by webcam"

Scammers are using malware and webcams to obtain photos of their victims and then blackmailing them while masquerading as police. The photo is shown in a pop-up which says your PC has been frozen by police and will be unblocked after a fine has been paid. This scam can be prompted by the user accessing illegal music and movie download sites.

"Tax refund scams"

A new phishing email claiming to be from the ATO is currently circulating consumers and small businesses claiming they are entitled to a tax refund. All you have to do is click on an embedded link and complete an online form. **But watch out!** The online form and link are fake, and are designed to steal your personal information or infect your computer with malware.

Some Golden Rules

- If it looks too good to be true it probably is.
- Always get independent advice if an offer involves significant money, time or commitment.
- Remember, there are no get-richquick schemes: the only people who make money are the scammers.
- Do not agree to offers or deals straight away - tell the person you are getting independent advice.
- Never send money or give credit card or online account details to anyone you do not trust.

Tonight's (September) meeting - LED's and Wave Cards

Tonight, Robert Cloosterman will be giving his take on the use of LED's in our lives today. Now, I had to ask - what does LED stand for:-

Light Emitting Diodes.

And I also had to ask, what is it and how does it work?

I am sure Rob will totally enlighten us, but here is a little information to help us along the way.

- Light Emitting Diode (LED) is a type of electronics spare part that produces or emits light when connected to a circuit. It is commonly used as a light indicator when a certain electronic device is turned on.
- They are found in all kinds of devices, eg computers, digital clocks, remote controls, watches and television screens. They light up and tell you when your appliances are turned on.
- Basically, they are just tiny light bulbs that fit easily into an electrical circuit. They are significantly more efficient than 'compact fluorescent lighting' (CFL) and contain none of the mercury hazards of CFL's.

Wave Cards



We will also be showing and discussing new "wave cards" (a type of credit card / debit card / pension card).

A Wave Card is a form of contactless payment that removes the need to physically swipe or insert a smart card into a payment reader. By simply holding the Wave card at a close range of 4cm

from the reader, the card will be detected.

Wave Card is a fast and simple way for consumers to make payment. No signature is required and there is no need to hand the card to the cashier – consumers simply wave, pay and go.

Recipe Corner

Apricot and Walnut Tea Loaf

Ingredients

1 cup (150g) dried apricots, roughly chopped

½ cup (125 ml) hot Black Tea 125g butter, at room temperature ½ cup (110g) caster sugar 1 egg ⅔ cup (100g) Self Raising Flour ¼ cup (30g) chopped walnuts



Method

Soak apricots in hot tea for 1 hour, until apricots have softened and tea absorbs into fruit.

Preheat oven to 180 °C. Grease and line a 13cm x 25cm loaf pan.

Using an electric mixer, cream butter and sugar together until pale and creamy. Add egg and beat well.

Fold in flour, walnuts and apricots.

Spoon into prepared pan.

Bake for 40-45 minutes until a skewer inserted comes out clean. Cool in pan for 5 minutes before turning onto a wire rack to cool.

- 8. I am a season, and follow after Winter.



CLEANING COMPUTER SCREENS


I need some help cleaning my computer screen. Last time I tried, it left smudges all over it. What should I do?

First check whether your computer screen is glass or plastic.

If you have an LCD monitor, the cleaning must be done carefully because the screens are plastic. Gently wipe the monitors with a lint-free cloth.

The best type is a natural fibre or micro-fibre cloth, as these are less prone to leaving scratches on surfaces. Wipe away any visible dust and dirt. Be careful not to rub too hard or you may rub the dust particles across the screen, resulting in tiny scratches. If you are not using a micro-fibre cloth, you will need to change the cloth often, or use the cloth in sections to avoid re-depositing dust onto other parts of the screen.

Next, try wiping the screen with a slightly damp cloth. Water is safe on most surfaces in very small amounts, but do not spray it directly onto your screen. Spray water onto a lint-free cloth and wring it out until the cloth is just damp. Gently clean your monitor using the same procedure as dusting. Do not use ammonia-based products such as window cleaner on an LCD monitor. Small amounts of window cleaner can be applied to a soft cloth and then to a glass screen but make sure the screen does not have a coating or finish on it. Stained monitor screens can be cleansed with one part water and one part isopropyl alcohol.


