Trevor and Jim have worked hard to set up our NEW IMPROVED PA system and to make things even better, the two screens were networked using a laptop and a tablet. Thankyou and well done to you both.



Lionel introduced John Kirby who demonstrated his frustration at having recently travelled overseas with multiple gadgets. His problem arose when batteries flattened and the chargers that he thought would suit more than one, didn't. His advice: Test all chargers before leaving home

Check voltages because not all USBs are standard.

His USB needed ½ an amp and his Tablet needed more—15 amps.

Anne Leddra has found a very helpful web site. forwardit.sa.gov.au which has plenty of basic computer information and is well worth a browse.

Anne then gave us hints on restoring old photos which were outlined in the August Newsletter.

Some programs available are

- Paintshop Pro \$100 to \$200
- Adobe Elements \$100 to \$200
- Photoshop CS6 \$1168 (Harvey Norman)
- Adobe Photoshop \$270 for a 12 month licence or from \$400 to \$4000 to purchase.
- Windows Photo Gallery is free and comes with most Windows programs.

Price usually means the difference between amateur and professional users,.

Trevor then continued with a demonstration using his Photoshop CS3, showing us how to lighten or darken old family photos, crop, remove red eye, lighten or darken old documents, giving us before and after examples. The family portrait repairs was quite amazing, and the 'fun' rearranging of his familiar face gave us all something to think about.

The old saying that '**photos never lie**' doesn't apply anymore.

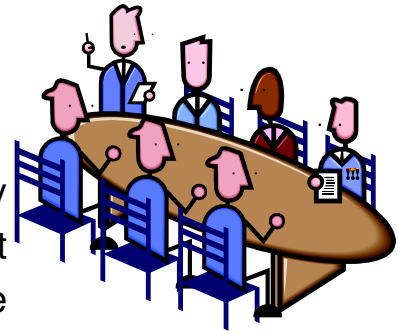

Recipe Corner

RICKETY ANNES



INGREDIENTS:

4 oz butter or Vidale Margarine (125 grams)
1 cup Cornflakes
1 cup SR Flour
½ cup walnuts (optional)
½ cup sugar
1 egg
½ cup sultanas

METHOD:

Melt the butter or margarine slightly, add sugar and beat well, mix in unbeaten egg, then sultanas, cornflakes, flour and walnuts. If desired cherries can be added. Drop teaspoonfuls on a cold floured oven tray and cook till golden brown, in a quick oven. This mixture makes approximately 30 cookies.

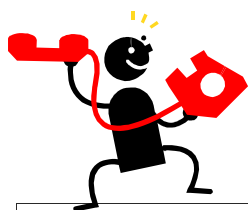

WHY DOES REBOOTING A COMPUTER FIX SO MANY PROBLEMS?

Continuing from August's Newsletter -

But why doesn't Windows simply fix the problem rather than restarting the driver or the computer itself? Well, because it can't — the code has encountered a problem and stopped working completely, so there's no way for it to continue. By restarting, the code can start from square one and hopefully it won't encounter the same problem again.

Examples of Restarting Fixing Problems

While certain problems require a complete restart because the operating system or a hardware driver has stopped working, not every problem does. Some problems may be fixable without a restart, though a restart may be the easiest option.

- 🕒 **Windows is Slow:** Let's say Windows is running very slowly. It's possible that a misbehaving program is using 99% CPU and draining the computer's resources. I could head to the task manager and look around, hoping to locate the misbehaving process and end it. If an average user encountered this same problem, they could simply reboot their computer to fix it rather than dig through their running processes.
- 🖥️ **Firefox or Another Program is Using Too Much Memory:** In the past, Firefox has been the poster child for memory leaks on average PCs. Over time, Firefox would often consume more and more memory, getting larger and larger and slowing down. Closing Firefox will cause it to relinquish all of its memory. When it starts again, it will start from a clean state without any leaked memory. This doesn't just apply to Firefox, but applies to any software with memory leaks.
- 🌐 **Internet or Wi-Fi Network Problems:** If you have a problem with your Wi-Fi or Internet connection, the software on 📶📶📶

your router or modem may have encountered a problem. Resetting the router—just by unplugging it from its power socket and then plugging it back in—is a common solution for connection problems.

In all cases, a restart wipes away the current state of the software. Any code that's stuck in a misbehaving state will be swept away too. When you restart, the computer or device will bring the system up from scratch, restarting all the software from square one so it will work just as well as it was working before.

'Soft Resets' vs 'Hard Resets'

In the mobile device world, there are two types of '**resets**' you can perform. A '**soft reset**' is simply restarting a device normally—turning it off and then on again. A '**hard reset**' is resetting its software state back to its factory default state.

When you think about it, both types of resets fix problems for a similar reason. For example, let's say your Windows computer refuses to boot or becomes completely infected with malware. Simply restarting the computer won't fix the problem, as the problem is with the files on the computer's hard drive—it has corrupted files or malware that loads at start up on its hard drive. However **reinstalling Windows** (performing a '**Refresh or Reset your PC**' operation in Windows 8 terms) will wipe away everything on the computer's hard drive, restoring it to its formerly clean state.

This is simpler than looking through the computer's hard drive, trying to identify the exact reason for the problems or trying to ensure that you've obliterated every last trace of malware. It's much faster to simply start over from a known-good, clean state instead of trying to locate every possible problem and fix it.

Ultimately, the answer is that 'resetting a computer wipes away the current state of the software, including any problems that have developed, and allows it to start over from square one.' It's easier and faster to start from a clean state than identify and fix any problems that may be occurring—in fact, in some cases, it may be impossible to fix problems without beginning from that clean state.

For a second I thought that these e-mails MAY have been genuine after all.

When she told me to turn on my computer and follow her instructions, I LIED and told her that I had loaned it to a 'friend'. She couldn't believe that I had loaned it! She then wanted my 'friend's' number so that she could contact her before it was too late and our e-mail account was cancelled. Surely she didn't believe me! When I asked her for her phone number (and

where was she phoning from), she gave me an address in Sydney and a phone number so that my 'friend' could phone her.

I immediately phoned Telstra and after explaining exactly what had happened, they assured me that it definitely was another SCAM, and were very pleased that I had let them know.



GOOGLE WINS THE TABLET BATTLE

Google beat Apple at its own game for the first time this year, with Android tablets out selling the iPad in Australia.

But the tablet war was as close as it could be Down under, with just 1% separating the two technology giants, and Apple expected to reclaim the crown in the final half of the year.

Telsyte revealed results of the closely fought battle in its Australian Media Table Market Study, reporting Australians bought 1.8 million tablet computers in the first six months of 2014, bringing tablets to 10.8 million Australians.

But while the figures sound healthy, sales actually dropped 28 percent from last year, which managing director Foad Fadaghi described as a 'post Christmas hang-over' after a late—2013 spending spree.

Google Android tablets include models from Samsung, Sony, Lenovo, Toshiba, ASUS, LG and Acer.
