

The Make A Wish Foundation, has agreed to donate 7 cents for every time this message is sent on.

*This information arrived this morning, from Microsoft and Norton.Please send it to everybody you know who accesses the Internet. You may receive an apparently harmless email with a PowerPoint presentation called "Life is beautiful.pps." If you receive it **DO NOT OPEN THE FILE UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES**, and delete it immediately. If you open this file, a message will appear on your screen saying: "It is too late now, your life is no longer beautiful", subsequently you will **LOSE EVERYTHING IN YOUR PC** and the person who sent it to you will gain access to your name, email and password. This is a new virus which started to circulate on Saturday afternoon. **WE NEED TO DO EVERYTHING POSSIBLE TO STOP THIS VIRUS.** UOL has already confirmed its dangerousness, and the antivirus Softs are not capable of destroying it. The virus has been created by a hacker who calls himself "life owner", and who aims to destroy domestic PCs and who also fights Microsoft in court! That's why it comes disguised with extension pps. He fights in court for the Windows-XP patent. **MAKE A COPY OF THIS EMAIL TO ALL YOUR FRIENDS.***

Error Messages in Microsoft Operating Systems

Most PC operators have encountered Error Messages popping up in Microsoft®, sometimes these are easily remedied by looking for the file causing the error and deleting or reinstalling the offending program. Often the error message will mean nothing to the average user. Take a note of the message. Ignore any list of numbers/addresses and copy the text message. Frequently, opening Google and inserting the message as a search string will get answers. Sometimes the answer sites will tell you what to do to fix the problem but after paying a fee.

Microsoft ® have their own very extensive *Knowledge Base* that more often or not, will prove to be most useful in understanding and remedying the Error Message. Go to <<http://search.support.microsoft.com/search/default.aspx>>

At the search page, you can select the Microsoft Software being used, type the error message and the search engine will find a list of Articles that contain the message in priority order. Each article has an Article Number and more often than not, has links to other articles that may be useful.

Getting to know how to use the *Knowledge Base* is a good skill to master.

MSWord Format:- Indents and Spacing

Word allows you to adjust the line and paragraph spacing to make your document look better. By default, spaces are *single* and sized to the font size.

When using titles and paragraphs, set the spacing between paragraphs and headings by opening the **Format** Tab, select **Paragraphs** and in the Paragraph Dialogue Box, you can change the spacing *before* the highlighted paragraph, (ie: between the header and the first line); spaces in the paragraph, single, one and a half or double line. You can specify a different space dimension *after* the paragraph.

If you are using a larger Font for the Header, the spacing will be better if you change the spacing before the paragraph, looks better and avoids the use of ugly hard returns to space out your work..

Windows XP TOOL BOX

Practical hints for the serious Tinkerer



Note: The Editor has extracted these tips and info off of Internet Help Pages. To seek your own hints, Search with your favourite search engine and try “XP Help” or “XP Tips”

Tip: Increase available disk space by scaling back System Restore.

It's not perfect, but Windows System Restore is a useful first step in recovering your PC or drive from a major system error. However, it can consume more than 10 percent of your total hard drive space.

If you find yourself desperate for an extra few gigabytes — particularly on secondary storage drives — there's an easy way to reclaim data space by simply limiting the number of System Restore points Windows XP establishes. This one's a snap and there's no tangible increase of risk, which is why we love it.

1. Right-click on My Computer and select Properties > System Restore.
2. If you have just one hard drive, skip to step 3. Otherwise, select the drive on which you want to gain storage space and click the Settings button.
3. Adjust the slider to the left to use less disk space, and Win XP will reduce the number of System Restore points by the appropriate amount.

Microsoft Word, other word processors and text programs

Every Word document has a template associated with it. Templates control things like which styles and macros are available to the document. A document can have only one template associated with it at a time, and you can change that template at any time you desire.

If you want to find out which template is attached to a document, you can do so by choosing Templates and Add-Ins from the Tools menu. (In Word 2007, display the Developer tab of the ribbon and then click on the Document Template option.) Word displays the Templates and Add-ins dialog box.

The field at the top of the dialog box indicates the name of the template associated with your document.

Have you been vaccinated against Influenza yet?

The flu season is again upon us, and older people and those who are ill are being urged to get their annual vaccination to protect against the coming flu season.

Health Minister John Hill said those who have a higher risk of infection are at the greatest risk. "People should be getting their flu shots now, not waiting until the colder weather hits," he said.

"Influenza has the potential to hit hard every winter, and people who are considered at risk — those with chronic diseases like diabetes or heart and lung problems, and older people — are particularly vulnerable

Flu vaccine is free for people over 65 years of age, who I would urge to take up this offer for free vaccination. Older people should contact their GP for further information or to arrange a vaccination — and while the vaccination itself is free, they will still need to pay the usual fee or gap payment for a doctors' visit. The SA Health Department also recommends people in nursing homes and long-term care facilities are vaccinated, including health care workers who have contact with people in high-risk groups.
