St. Patrick's Day



Yesterday was St Patrick's Day, also my Mother-in-Laws Birthday.

So I decided to ask Google who was St Patrick.

1. St. Patrick is the patron saint of Ireland, although he was born in Britain, around 385AD. His parents Calpurnius and Conchessa were Roman citizens living in either Scotland or Wales, according to different versions of his story.
2. As a boy of 14 he was captured and taken to Ireland where he spent six years in slavery herding sheep. He returned to Ireland in his 30s as a missionary among the Celtic pagans.
3. Legend has it that he used the native shamrock as a symbol of the holy trinity when preaching and brought the Latin alphabet to Ireland.
4. Miracles attributed to him include the driving of serpents out of Ireland. However, evidence suggests post-glacial Ireland never had any snakes in the first place.
5. Wearing green, eating green food and even drinking green beer, is said to commemorate St Patrick's use of the shamrock - although blue was the original colour of his vestments.
6. St Patrick was said to have proclaimed that everyone should have a drop of the "hard stuff" on his feast day after chastising an innkeeper who served a short measure of whiskey. In the custom known as "drowning the shamrock", the shamrock that has been worn on a lapel or hat is put in the last drink of the evening.
7. Popular Irish toasts on St Patrick's Day, include: may the roof above us never fall in, and may we friends beneath it never fall out.
8. St. Patrick's Day was first celebrated in America in Boston, Massachusetts, in 1737. Around 34 million modern Americans claim Irish ancestry.
9. It is believed that St Patrick died on March 17 in 461AD. It is a national holiday in Ireland, and on the island of Montserrat in the Caribbean, which was founded by Irish refugees. It is a bank holiday in Northern Ireland and a provincial holiday in the Canadian province of Newfoundland.
10. Dublin has a parade that attracts hundreds of thousands of people, while in Chicago the river is dyed green for a few hours. The biggest parade is normally held in New York, while the largest celebration in the southern hemisphere is in Sydney, Australia.

Sticky Date Pudding

Ingredients:-

- 185 grammes whole pitted dates
- 60 grammes butter
- 1 teaspoon bicarb of soda
- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup castor sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 cup self-raising flour
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 cup water

Sauce Ingredients:-

- 1 cup brown sugar (firmly packed)
- 6 tablespoons thickened cream
- 125 grammes butter
- 1 teaspoon vanilla essence

Method:-

Grease a 7" spring form round cake tin. Chop the dates and put in a saucepan with the cup of water, bring to the boil and simmer for 3 minutes. Then take off the heat and add bicarb of soda and vanilla. Cream the butter and castor sugar and add the eggs, gradually fold in the flour then stir in the date mixture (this will be runny). Pour into prepared cake tin. Bake at 180° for 30 minutes. Pour $\frac{1}{2}$ the toffee sauce over then bake for a further 10 minutes.

Toffee Method:-

Mix sugar, cream, butter and vanilla into a saucepan, stir until sauce boils. Simmer for 2 minutes.

To serve reheat individual slices in microwave, heat the toffee sauce in microwave and pour over the slices.

Serve with ice cream or large dollops of cream.

Check your hard Drive for errors

1. Double-click **My Computer**, and then right-click the hard disk that you want to check.
2. Click **Properties**, and then click **Tools**.
3. Under **Error-checking**, click **Check Now**. A dialog box that shows the **Check disk options** is displayed,
4. Use one of the following procedures:
 - To run Chkdsk in read-only mode, click **Start**.
 - To repair errors without scanning the volume for bad sectors, select the **Automatically fix file system errors** check box, and then click **Start**.
 - To repair errors, locate bad sectors, and recover readable information, select the **Scan for and attempt recovery of bad sectors** check box, and then click **Start**.

Note If one or more of the files on the hard disk are open, you will receive the following message: The disk check could not be performed because the disk check utility needs exclusive access to some Windows files on the disk. These files can be accessed by restarting Windows. Do you want to schedule the disk check to occur the next time you restart the computer? Click **Yes** to schedule the disk check, and then restart your computer to start the disk check

Printers

In 1953, the first high-speed printer was developed by Remington-Rand for use on the [Univac](#) computer.

In 1938, [Chester Carlson](#) invented a dry printing process called electro photography commonly called a Xerox, the foundation technology for laser printers to come.

The original laser printer called EARS was developed at the Xerox Palo Alto Research Center beginning in 1969 and completed in November, 1971. Xerox Engineer, Gary Starkweather adapted Xerox copier technology adding a laser beam to it to come up with the laser printer. According to Xerox, "The Xerox 9700 Electronic Printing System, the first xerographic laser printer product, was released in 1977. The 9700, a direct descendent from the original PARK "EARS" printer which pioneered in laser scanning optics, character generation electronics, and page-formatting software, was the first product on the market to be enabled by PARK research."

According to IBM, "the very first IBM 3800 was installed in the central accounting office at F. W. Woolworth's North American data center in Milwaukee, Wisconsin in 1976." The IBM 3800 Printing System was the industry's first high-speed, laser printer. A laser printer that operated at speeds of more than 100 impressions-per-minute. It was the first printer to combine laser technology and electro photography according to IBM.

In 1992, Hewlett-Packard released the popular LaserJet 4, the first 600 by 600 dots per inch resolution laser printer.

In 1976, the inkjet printer was invented, but it took until 1988 for the inkjet to become a home consumer item with Hewlett-Packard's release of the DeskJet inkjet printer, priced at a whopping \$1000.

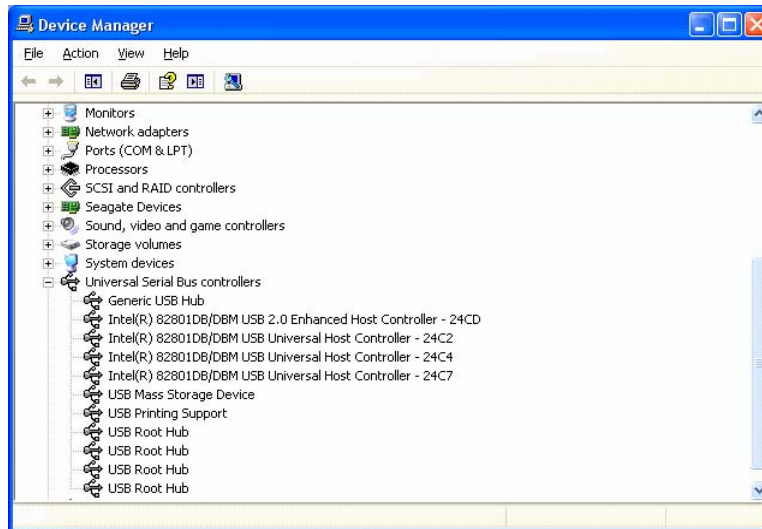

USB Bandwidth, Port Information

Last month, I wrote an article about USB Bandwidth and the difficulties of running multiple USB devices on a single port, albeit through a USB hub.

You can check your PC hubs through Control Panel, identify the ports and the amount of Bandwidth that devices are using. Go to Control Panel, System; Hardware Tab and then to Device Manager.

Scroll down to the Universal Serial Bus Controllers and click on the + sign to expand the Line thus:



The Generic USB Hub on the first line, the other lines list the number of ports/controllers that you have in your PC. The line with "USB Enhanced" indicates that the USB meets USB-2 standard.

Next, on each of the controllers, Right Click, select Properties, then the Advanced Tab. You will see the device and the bandwidth used, Idle would be around 10% A USB hard drive would require at least 35% of the bandwidth.

Next, Right click on the first USB Root Hub, select the "Power" Tab, The device using the hub will be shown and the power consumption in Milliamps, (mA), remember that we saw that most hubs only support 500mA, overloading the hub will cause the PC to crash at best.

By seeing what devices are on which hubs, it allow you to see if you can switch devices to other port/hubs if overload becomes apparent. In the above example, the first root-hub is powering the PC mouse and is using 100mA. The second Root Hub has the printer support and with the printer off, still uses 2mA, turned on, it would use more. However, it is most likely that the hub could share the mouse without problems and free up the mouse hub for something else.
