Top Scams

Tough economic times are, unfortunately, boom times for scammers, as people, desperate for money and jobs let down their guards and are more likely to pursue questionable financial opportunities that caution, might ordinarily warn them away from. And as folks become more inured to monetary woes, their charitable inclinations are more easily exploited by scammers pretending to be persons in need of sympathetic helping hands. Listed below are several pervasive forms of scams that have proven particularly alluring to potential victims when times are tough.

Nigerian Scam

A wealthy foreigner who needs help moving millions of dollars from his homeland, promises a hefty percentage of this fortune as a reward for assisting him.

Foreign Lottery Scam

Announcements inform recipients that they've won large sums of money in foreign lotteries.

Secret Shopper Scam

Advertisers seek applicants for paid positions as 'secret' or 'mystery' shoppers.

Work-at-Home Scam

Advertisers offer kits that enable home workers to make money posting links on the Internet.

Family Member in Distress Scam

Scammers impersonate distressed family members in desperate need of money.

PRINTERS

Be Careful After Long Periods of Nonuse

SUMMARY: After your printer sits idle for many days, print a few test pages before a larger document.

Some people rarely use their printers. If you fit this category but need to print something after your printer has been sitting unused for several weeks, don't expect that first sheet of paper to come out brilliantly. Print heads get dirty, ink may dry or smear, etc, resulting in a not-so-nice-looking document. Before you print that important document after a period of non-use, you may want to clean the print head and/or print a test page first, to make sure everything is in good working order. Refer to your printer manual for instructions.

Mother's Day History

Contrary to popular belief, Mother's Day was not conceived and fine-tuned in the boardroom of Hallmark. The earliest tributes to mothers date back to the annual spring festival the Greeks dedicated to Rhea, the mother of many deities, and to the offerings ancient Romans made to their Great Mother of Gods, Cybele. Christians celebrated this festival on the fourth Sunday in Lent in honour of Mary, mother of Christ. In England this holiday was expanded to include all mothers and was called Mothering Sunday.

In the United States, Mother's Day started nearly 150 years ago, when Anna Jarvis, an Appalachian homemaker, organized a day to raise awareness of poor health conditions in her community, a cause she believed would be best advocated by mothers. She called it "Mother's Work Day."

Fifteen years later, Julia Ward Howe, a Boston poet, pacifist, suffragist, and author of the lyrics to the "Battle Hymn of the Republic," organized a day encouraging mothers to rally for peace, since she believed they bore the loss of human life more harshly than anyone else.

In 1905 when Anna Jarvis died, her daughter, also named Anna, began a campaign to memorialize the life work of her mother. Legend has it that young Anna remembered a Sunday school lesson that her mother gave in which she said, "I hope and pray that someone, sometime, will found a memorial mother's day". There are many days for men, but none for mothers."

Anna began to lobby prominent businessmen like John Wannamaker, and politicians including Presidents Taft and Roosevelt to support her campaign to create a special day to honour mothers. At one of the first services organized to celebrate Anna's mother in 1908, at her church in West Virginia, Anna handed out her mother's favorite flower, the white carnation. Five years later, the House of Representatives adopted a resolution calling for officials of the federal government to wear white carnations on Mother's Day. In 1914 Anna's hard work paid off when Woodrow Wilson signed a bill recognizing Mother's Day as a national holiday.

At first, people observed Mother's Day by attending church, writing letters to their mothers, and eventually, by sending cards, presents, and flowers. With the increasing gift-giving activity associated with Mother's Day, Anna Jarvis became enraged. She believed that the day's sentiment was being sacrificed at the expense of greed and profit. In 1923 she filed a lawsuit to stop a Mother's Day festival, and was even arrested for disturbing the peace at a convention selling carnations for a war mother's group. Before her death in 1948, Jarvis is said to have confessed that she regretted ever starting the mother's day tradition.

Despite Jarvis's misgivings, Mother's Day has flourished in the United States. In fact, the second Sunday of May has become the most popular day of the year to dine out, and telephone lines record their highest traffic, as sons and daughters everywhere take advantage of this day to honour and to express appreciation of their mothers

Microsoft Word 2003 Security and Privacy

Remove Personal Information from a File

Remove your name and that of those who made changes from your Word 2003 documents.

Normally, when you save a file in Microsoft Word 2003, along with the saved file are properties containing the author's name (you) as well as the names of those who may have suggested or made tracked changes in the document. If you wish to distribute a document that does not contain this information:

1. Open the document you want to protect.
2. Choose "Tools" then "Options".
3. When the "Options" multi-tabbed dialog box appears, click the "Security" tab.
4. Check "Remove personal information from file properties on save".
5. Click "OK" to close the dialog box.



Windows XP - Outlook Express

Request Read Receipt for an Individual Message

When sending an important message in Outlook Express in Windows XP, you can request a read receipt for said message. This way you can help ensure your e-mail reached its destination and was read, even if it has not been responded to yet.

Note that while read receipts may be a good idea for certain messages, receiving this notification is not guaranteed. Your recipient may use non-Microsoft software that does not support read receipts. Also, e-mail users with Outlook, Outlook Express, and Windows Mail can configure their software to never send receipts or ignore particular requests



To request a receipt anyway, when composing an e-mail message, select the "Tools" menu and check "Request Read Receipt". This will check the menu item. You can remove the receipt request for the message before sending it by repeating the step.

Digital Camera Memory

Accidentally Washed a Memory Card?

SUMMARY: What to do if a digital camera memory card accidentally made its way through the washer.

You know that you should do whatever you can to keep digital camera memory from water. However, what if you placed a card in your pocket, then accidentally left it inside some clothes through the washer? Is the card worthless, and are all the photos unrecoverable?

First off, don't panic! You may be able to recover the photos, but do not insert the memory into your camera. If the media is damaged, trying to insert it into the camera may damage the pins, preventing the camera from ever reading any media. Plus, if the media is wet, water could seep into the camera, completely damaging the internals.

First, place the media in a dry area free from moisture and do not try anything until all wetness is gone; you may want to wait a few days. Then, instead of placing the questionable memory into the camera, use an **external USB reader**, not one built into a computer. This way if inserting the memory damages the reader, you'll hopefully only be out a few dollars instead of losing a camera or damaging a computer. Again, do not insert media into the reader if it has any moisture!

If the photos do not display correctly, you still may have a chance for recovery by using a file and digital photo recovery tool.

Once (or if) the photos are displayable, immediately back up your photos to your hard drive and/or offline media! A washed card that seems to work one day may fail the next, which is why I would not recommend ever placing the memory back into a camera. Instead, purchase another card
