Earlier in the year your committee decided to apply for the grant from the Commonwealth Government "Positive Aging Development Group". As it was felt that the chances of gaining this grant would be fairly slim, we also applied for a second grant with the local Onkaparinga Council – Community Development Grants.

As we have already said on our last newsletter, we have been successful with the PADG Grant.

We have done it again!

We have been successful with this second grant - from the Onkaparinga Council for \$1305. The grant is to be specifically used in the purchase of a laptop computer with associated software.

The PADG grant money will not flow for a time, but Jim Greenfield and I are invited to attend the local Council Grant Presentation Ceremony on 27th July. Mayor Rosenberg will do the presentation. (Jim may not gain entry – as I have been informed scruffy people will be ejected).

These combined grants will enable us to keep up to date with good quality laptops for our training days, Windows 7 operating systems with at least one copy of Office 10 for our main club computer. Other Office software packages will be purchased together with consideration for other training packages. We are not sure if we can amend our initial request and requirements to include an "ear hoop" microphone – or lapel microphone in the grant.

From a committee point of view we have been enjoying quite a busy this year. Currently eight of our committee have "gone north" or going "east" for the next few months. Combining these departures with the recent constitutional changes we have been considering; the activities that will be necessary to manage the distribution of funds from the above grants; running several "Computing Basics" courses (that are proving quite successful) we are running out of "puff". If anyone would like to assist with these classes as "helpers" or "assistants" that would be gratefully received.

As an alternative to running more "Computing Basic" courses we are considering doing a short course on Email and Internet usage at \$50 per person. To do this we need another 2-3 persons to enroll. Given we get this encouragement the need for the additional helpers as above is removed.

Widows 7 Tips

- (1) Pressing the Windows and plus or minus keys activates the Magnifier, which lets you zoom in on the entire desktop or open a rectangular magnifying lens to zoom in and out of parts of your screen. You can customize the Magnifier options to follow your mouse pointer or keyboard cursor.
- (2) Windows 7 prefers external hard disk drives that use the NTFS file system: Its integrated backup program cannot back up files from or to drives that use the older FAT32 file system. So, if you select a drive that uses FAT32 as the backup location, Windows 7 displays an error message. FAT32, a leftover from the days of Windows 98, works with both MacOS and Windows (which is why most external hard disks use this file system by default), but it lacks the features needed to fully support Windows 7 backup. Use Convert.exe to solve this problem. Open a command-prompt session and use the following command to change your external hard disk's file system: `convert x: / fs:ntfs` (replace x with the actual drive letter of your external hard disk). Convert.exe will check your external hard disk for errors, verify there's enough space for conversion, and then convert with abandon. While this theoretically will not destroy your data, we recommend you back up your files first

WHAT WEB BROWSER SHOULD I USE?

One of the Computers industry's fiercest arguments for the last 15 years has been which Web browser is the best Now the pitch of the browser argument is getting louder — and more vendors are popping up, as the browser battle migrates from desktops to smartphones.

Browser that launched an industry turns 15

Netscape Navigator, the first popular browser, launched the Internet industry in October 1994 by allowing average users to view text and images posted on Web sites. Less than a year later, Microsoft entered the fray by bundling the free Internet Explorer browser into its Windows operating system. Within two years, Microsoft was the leading browser manufacturer, and Netscape was on the decline, prompting anti-trust investigations in the United States and Europe.

The browser market was shaken up again in 2004, when **Netscape's browser** was reborn as open software called **Firefox**, which is distributed by Mozilla.

Firefox continues to be a favorite among many users because of its speed, and it remains the toughest competitor that Microsoft faces in the browser arena.

Firefox 4, was released in 2010, it featured performance enhancements designed to make it even speedier. A third contender joined the browser argument in 2008, when Google introduced its open source Chrome browser. Chrome 5.0, which was released as beta code in May 2010. Chrome 5.0 competes against Internet Explorer in the speed department and supports emerging standards such as HTML5.

IE8, the current version of Internet Explorer, is considered to be the best browser when it comes to thwarting malware, according to a March 2010 report. But IE8's anti-malware feature also introduced some security risks that were patched in June 2010. A preview of IE9 was released in May 2010, but the software isn't due out until 2011.

As of April 2010, Internet Explorer retained 60% of overall browser market share, followed by 25% for Firefox and 7% for Chrome, according to Netmarketshare.com.

Which vendor will win the browser argument? Perhaps, it will be none of these vendors because today's best-selling smartphones use alternative browsers. Symbian devices from Nokia and others typically use their own browsers or an alternative from Opera Software. The iPhone uses Apple's own Safari browser. Google's Android operating system for mobile devices has its own browser with Adobe Flash 10.1 support. And RIM's BlackBerry has a new-and-improved browser that stems from its acquisition of Torch Mobile.

With all these new entrants into the market, the browser argument is likely to remain just as fierce and just as loud in the future.

Internet Explorer 9 also supports the HTML5 video and audio tags and the Web Open Font Format. Microsoft has released Internet Explorer 9 as a major out-of-band version that is not tied to the release schedule of any particular version of Windows, unlike previous versions.[ⓘ]

The system requirements for Internet Explorer 9 are Windows 7, Windows Server 2008 R2, Windows Vista Service Pack 2 or Windows Server 2008 SP2 with the Platform Update.[ⓘ]

Windows XP and earlier versions of Windows are not supported are not supported.

Internet Explorer 9 is the last version of Internet Explorer to be supported on Windows Vista; Internet Explorer 10 will only be supported on Windows 7

Error Reporting – It Works

Recently I reloaded my XP computer and for the first few days the monitor just did not look right. I checked the plugs, and all OK there. A check of Device Manager did not reveal any dreaded yellow or red marks, so it seems there were no problems with the drivers etc.

After a few days I turned the computer on, and nothing, there was just a black screen. I was unable to start in Safe Mode, I connected a second monitor to the computer and still only a black screen.

Turning the computer off, unplugging from the 240 power point and waiting a half hour, I turned the computer on and it started, but when doing so I received a message that the computer had recovered from a 'Critical Error' and did I want to send an Error Report.

This time I chose to do so, and within seconds Internet Explorer opened and I received a Windows Error Report advising there was a problem with the Intel Graphics Driver, and that the driver had stopped working properly. The report stated an update of drivers might prevent this problem from recurring, and listed four options I could try to obtain an update driver. (See below for a screen shot of the Error Report)

A driver update, if available, might prevent this problem from recurring.

There are several ways of locating and installing driver updates, but it is best to let Windows do this for you. Try the first step below, which describes the process. If it doesn't produce a driver update that solves the problem, then try the remaining steps in the order given.

Within seconds of following the suggestions a new driver was installed on my computer and when restarting the monitor was back to looking great.

Normally I disable Error Reporting, but this time I'm glad I did not. And this leads me to explain what a Driver is:

Definition: A driver is a small piece of software that tells the operating system and other software how to communicate with a piece of hardware.

For example, all printers come accompanied with drivers to install - that tell the operating system exactly how to print information on the page. Sound card drivers tell your software exactly how to translate data into audio signals that the card can output to a set of speakers. The same applies to video cards, keyboards, monitors, etc.

The drivers for each piece of hardware in your Windows computer are centrally managed from Device Manager, available in all versions of Microsoft Windows.

ADVANCE AUSTRALIA FAIR



National Anthem

'Advance Australia Fair' is the national anthem of Australia. A revised version of a late nineteenth century patriotic song, it was officially declared the national anthem on 19 April 1984.

The composer, Peter Dodds McCormick, a Scot, composed 'Advance Australia Fair' under the pen-name 'Amicus' (amicus is the Latin word for 'friend'). It was first performed in Sydney on Saint Andrew's Day, 1878. An amended version was also sung by a choir of 10,000 at the inauguration of the Commonwealth of Australia on 1 January, 1901. In 1907, the Australian Government awarded McCormick £100 for his composition. Peter McCormick died in 1916 and 'Advance Australia Fair' became free of copyright in 1966. The Commonwealth of Australia, however, does copyright the officially proclaimed lyrics and particular arrangements of music. Non-commercial public use of the anthem is permitted, but commercial use requires permission.

Some of the original words of the song have been changed for the official version. 'Australia's sons let us rejoice' was the original first line; this has been replaced with 'Australians all let us rejoice'. In the third verse of the original song, two lines were changed—'To make our youthful Commonwealth' became 'To make this Commonwealth of ours', and 'For loyal sons beyond the seas' became 'For those who've come across the seas'.

How 'Advance Australia Fair' became the national anthem

The official anthem was 'God Save the Queen' (or 'King') from 1788 to 1974, although numerous commercial and official competitions were held over the years to find a substitute. The first was held in 1840.

John Dunmore Lang, who published an 'Australian Anthem' and an 'Australian Hymn' in 1826, was an early advocate of a distinctively Australian anthem. 'The Song of Australia' was written in 1859 by Caroline Carleton, and it was suggested to the Prime Minister in 1929 as a possible national anthem.

The issue of a truly national anthem was raised persistently before the 1956 Olympic Games, which were held in Melbourne. 'Advance Australia Fair' and 'Waltzing Matilda' were the two songs most strongly favoured then as the new anthem. 'Waltzing Matilda' was composed in 1895, with lyrics by one of Australia's best known poets, AB 'Banjo' Paterson.

On Australia Day, 26 January, in 1972, the number of entries (more than 400) received in an Australia-wide national anthem quest gave an indication of the interest in a new anthem.

Exactly a year later a government-sponsored competition was announced, which drew 2500 entries for the words and 1300 for the music. The judges selected six entries for the words, but rejected all the musical entries.

The polls and what followed

The quest for an Australian national anthem continued. In 1974 a public opinion poll sampled an estimated 60 000 people to select from three possible anthems: 'Advance Australia Fair', 'Waltzing Matilda' and 'Song of Australia'. 'Advance Australia Fair' polled 51.4 per cent. Following this result the then Prime Minister, Gough Whitlam, announced that 'Advance Australia Fair' would be the national anthem, except on specifically Royal occasions, when both it and 'God Save the Queen' would be played.

In 1976, after a change of government, 'God Save the Queen' was reinstated for Royal, vice-regal, defense and loyal toast occasions, with 'Advance Australia Fair' to be played on all other official occasions.

In May 1977, however, a national poll was conducted to ascertain the public choice of a national song. This time more than seven million people were issued with ballot papers. The results were: 'Advance Australia Fair' 43.2 per cent, 'Waltzing Matilda' 28.3 per cent, 'God Save the Queen' 18.7 per cent and 'Song of Australia' 9.6 per cent. Despite the poll results, adoption of the new national anthem met widespread opposition.

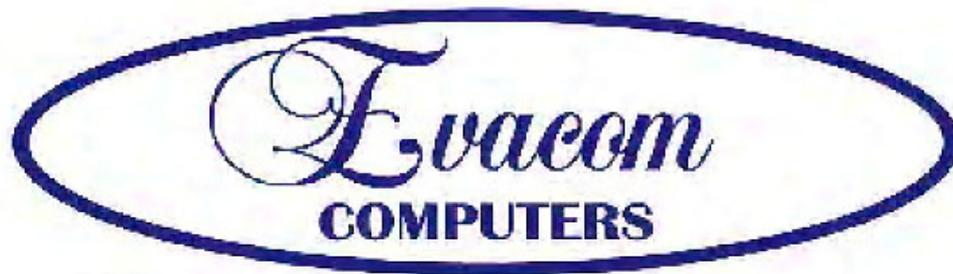
It was not until April 1984 that the Governor-General issued a proclamation that 'God Save the Queen' was designated the Royal Anthem, to be played at public engagements in Australia attended by the members of the Royal family. 'Advance Australia Fair' was finally declared to be the Australian national anthem.

Usually 'God Save the Queen' is played at the start of Royal functions and 'Advance Australia Fair' at the end, unless it is more appropriate to play both anthems at the start. 'Advance Australia Fair' is played at all other official functions.
