

Commonwealth and Local Council Grant Update A Report from the Secretary Trevor Francis

Since last month's AGM, the new committee has been briefed on earlier committee deliberations in regard to our upcoming and ongoing equipment requirements. The old committee had decided not to make any decisions on what to buy nor when to buy until the new committee was established at the AGM.

Now, initial decisions and purchases have been made –with more to follow later. The underlying focus to this point is on training, with the purchase of dedicated club laptops with latest Microsoft Office packages for our training programs. Also, we have purchased an “upmarket” wide screen 64 bit laptop for committee purposes. It is anticipated that this unit will see the club enabled to assess and undertake exercises in transitioning from x86 (32 bit) units to the 64 bit platform and programs. As we have already seen and encountered, this transitioning is not “plain sailing” with several older programs and equipment not wishing to run on this new platform. However, as we wish to keep the club as up to date as possible, and to be able to answer questions as they arise, these sorts of challenges are to be expected. In some cases they can be overcome, but in others, some of the much old programs will become defunct.

As a club, it was also felt we needed colour laser printing capability and a colour laser colour printer has been purchased.

All the above (including 2 x Microsoft Office 10 packages) have cost just over \$3000. This leaves the available grant money, still to spend at around \$1700.

Again for training purposes we will be considering other useful training software to share at club nights or in training sessions. At this stage no decisions have been made on additional equipment or software.



Lectern

A lectern (from the Latin lectus, past participle of legere, "to read") is a reading desk with a slanted top, usually placed on a stand or affixed to some other form of support, on which documents or books are placed as support for reading aloud, as in a [scripture](#) reading, [lecture](#), or [sermon](#). Mad phone call to Jim – No answer - he was out.


So I sat and pondered. Thought I would start in SAFE MODE. Was it F8 or F2 ???


